

WIGAN AND INCE.

WIGAN is an ancient and important market town, parliamentary and municipal borough, township and parish, 19 miles north-east from Liverpool, 18 north-west from Manchester, 195 north north-west from London, 10 west from Bolton, 16 south from Preston, 14 north from Warrington, 10 north-east from St. Helens, 38 south from Lancaster, and 19 south-east from Southport. The London and North-Western, the Lancashire and Yorkshire, and Lancashire Union lines of railway afford communication with all parts of the kingdom. The town has also the advantage of water conveyance by the Leeds and Liverpool Canal. The principal part of the town is situated on rising ground of considerable steepness towards the north and east, and the town mainly extends from this to the north, north-east, and south. The River Douglas runs through it, being crossed by several bridges. This stream was made navigable under the powers of an act of parliament obtained in 1719, but since the construction of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal the river course has been disused, as the Canal Company bought out the rights of navigation. The Douglas forms a great bend at Wigan, having come southerly from Rivington Pike, it now turns west and north to its confluence with the Ribble, above Southport. The Wigan coal field is one of the most important and productive in the kingdom. In addition to ordinary coal of excellent quality, a peculiar species—"cannel coal"—is found here, of great value from its highly inflammable nature. It is used principally for the manufacture of gas. There are upwards of eighty coal pits in the neighbourhood of Wigan; one of these, at Rose Bridge, is the deepest shaft in the kingdom. The various collieries are connected by branch lines with the railways mentioned above. The iron trade has latterly become a most important feature in the district. Very extensive furnaces, forges, rolling mills, &c. are now in full operation, affording employment to large numbers of hands. The proximity of Liverpool and the facilities for carriage naturally brought a portion of the cotton manufacture to Wigan, where it has flourished to a considerable extent, there being several mills of the largest size for spinning and the manufacture of calicoes, checks, &c. There are also iron and brass foundries and engineering works, manufactories for spades, shovels, edge tools, screw bolts, tarpaulins and brattice cloth, chemical works, oil distilleries, several large breweries, &c. The history of Wigan is not less interesting than that of many towns of greater size. There are evidences that it was a place of note before British history began. The Ancient Britons probably had one of their entrenched towns on the hill which has the Parish Church near its summit, for when the greater part of south Lancashire was marsh-land or forest, such an isolated elevation, commanding a view of the valley of the Douglas, would be likely to attract the notice of men whose small tribes were constantly quarrelling, and whose subsistence was the chase. When the Romans had completed their conquest of Britain, they made roads that passed through Wigan, but there is no reason to believe that there was a station of any importance here, or that the roads were other than vicinal ways. The main road from the north to Mancunium (Manchester), possibly passed down the Blackrod valley, the military station of Coccium being probably near that village; but the road that can be traced from Wigan northwards towards Ribchester, and south towards Warrington, was merely to connect this place with the main system of Roman military roads. The dome-shaped monticule between Whelley and the bed of the Douglas, though attributed as a

military post to Cromwellian times, is more likely to have been a Roman post of observation. Roman coins have been found in Wigan, and more at Standish. The silent evidences of urn, coin, and earthwork are all of Roman domination that is left about Wigan, and but little of these. When the Romans were gone away the British had many struggles with the Saxons, and that hero of romance, King Arthur, is said to have won several battles in and about Wigan; but the sole authority for this statement is the following passage from "Nennius's History of the Britons":—"Then it was that the magnanimous Arthur, with all the kings and military force of Britain, fought against the Saxons, and though there were many more noble than himself, yet he was twelve times chosen their commander and was as often conqueror. * * * The second, third, fourth and fifth were on another river, by the Britons called Douglas (or Dubglas) in the region Linuis. * * * The eighth was near Gurnion Castle, where Arthur bore the image of the Holy Virgin Mother of God upon his shoulders, and through the power of our Lord Jesus Christ and the Holy Mary, put the Saxons to flight. * * * The twelfth was a most severe contest, when Arthur penetrated to the hill Badon. * * * There are no two commentators of note who are agreed about where these places are. Some say Dubglas is our Douglas, others place it in Scotland. The time at which Nennius wrote is variously ascribed to the seventh and ninth centuries, while the manuscript used is not earlier than the tenth. The only one of the twelve battles elsewhere mentioned is the twelfth, by Gildas, but who Gildas was, no one knows, and he mentions not the name of Arthur, so that this period of the history of Wigan we must leave in darkness as we find it. We know nothing certain of Wigan in Saxon times, but the syllable "gate," in the nomenclature of streets, is understood to indicate a Saxon origin, and so we may be assured of its existence then, though it is not unlikely that in the later Saxon period it was almost entirely uninhabited, as it is never mentioned in the celebrated Domesday Book. One reason for this may be that it was, probably, an island amongst marshland and mere, and the Haigh side of the Douglas would be more likely to maintain a population. The origin of the name is said to be Saxon, Wigen or Wibiggin, but both are doubtful. After the Norman conquest, and when the Normans and Saxons were beginning to form one nation, Wigan emerged from obscurity, and Henry III. granted its first charter. He also made his secretary, John Moncell, rector of Wigan and lord of the manor, and the manorial rights remained with the rectors until the Corporation purchased them. In the 23rd of Edward III. Wigan sent two burgesses to Parliament; and though none were sent in the next reign, and there have been other intervals, yet it has since been the usual practice to return two burgesses for this purpose. The feeble reign of Edward II. was marked by trouble, and it would seem that the king passed this way more than once. Thomas Earl of Lancaster rebelled and was defeated at Borough bridge, and afterwards executed. Among those who aided him were Ricardus de Holand, Willielmus de Bradshaghe, and Robertus de Cliderhou, parson of Wygan. The last was examined before the king for sending his sons to the earl and preaching treason in the church. He was fined £200, which was an enormous sum in those days, and bespoke the value of the living and manor of Wigan. William of Bradshaghe (or Haigh) seems to have escaped arrest, possibly by keeping out of the way, and he was a knight of the shire in this and the

succeeding reign. The payment for borough members was two shillings a day at this time, and six or eight days were allowed for the journey to Westminster. It was in these times that Lady Mabel Bradshaigh performed her penance of walking barefooted from Haigh to Mab's Cross, in Standishgate, for marrying while her lord was away crusading in Palestine. When John of Gaunt married Blanche of Lancaster, to her vast possessions he added many gifts from the king (Edward III.) his father. He obtained the title of duke, and about 1360, among other grants, he obtained the advowson of Wigan Church, and had it confirmed soon after. The county palatine—the earldom—and the Duchy of Lancaster passed through the line of Lancastrian kings, and Wigan would have its full share of the troubles in the Wars of the Roses. The earldom of Derby (West Derby), having become separate from the Duchy, the Stanley family became chiefs in this part of the county, and Sir Edward aided Lord Surrey at the battle of Flodden Field with bowmen and billmen from Wigan (A.D. 1513), as well as other parts of the county. In the changes that came after the Reformation a great decay of towns is mentioned, and in the act relating to this subject, in 1544, Wigan is enumerated among the suffering boroughs. In 1553 there was a general military muster of the whole realm, and the Hundred of Derby (West) produced the highest number of men in Lancashire—viz., 430, of which 52 were contributed by Wigan, and 67 by Prescott. In the reign of Queen Mary, the Protestants of Lancashire felt the force of persecution; and John Bradford, who was burnt in 1555, was a native of Manchester, and had preached in Wigan and the neighbouring towns. The chantry at the parish church was restored by this queen. Another military muster in the year 1574 gives 1090 men for West Derby. In this reign (Elizabeth's) Roman Catholics were persecuted for their assumed want of loyalty, and the laws against them were very severe, and in 1586 "the parson of Wigan" made a presentment of the names of priests concealed in the neighbourhood and of the persons who harboured them. Two years later we have an account of certain payments to officers of the Duchy of Lancaster, and among them figures £5 10s. as the fee of the "clerke and steward of Wigan," showing into whose pockets went the balance of the value of the rectory and manor. Coming to the time of the Stuarts we find that Orlando Bridgman, Esq., and Alexander Rigby, Esq., represented Wigan in the famous Long Parliament till they left it to attend to the king in the war. Wigan was held for Charles, and in 1642 James, Earl of Derby, marched from it to besiege Blackburn. In 1643 the Earl, who was strongly entrenched here, was driven out by Sir John Smeaton, and though there were some vicissitudes it was mostly held for the Parliament after. In 1648 a large number of persons were compelled to compound for their estates by the Parliament, and among them were the Gerards, of Ince and Bryn, Ralph Brown, of Aspull, and William Brown and William Tempest, of Wigan. The last two paid £20 and £7 respectively. The Duke of Hamilton quartered his troops here the night before Cromwell passed through and defeated him at Winwick, in 1648. Lord Derby was also defeated here at the battle of Wigan Lane, by Colonel Lilburne, August 25th, 1651, which prevented him carrying aid to Charles at Worcester, where he was finally defeated by Cromwell ten days after. Sir Thomas Tyldesley was killed in this battle (Wigan) and a monument was erected to his memory in 1689, which still stands on the scene of the conflict. Wigan sent members to some of Cromwell's Parliaments. We conclude this notice with the fact that the young pretender, Prince Charles Edward Stuart, passed through Wigan on his way to Derby in the ill-fated expedition in 1745. He slept at the Manor house, in Bishopgate, on the night of the 28th of November. The government of

this ancient borough, all old charters being superseded, is now vested in a Corporation consisting of a Recorder, Mayor, ten Aldermen, thirty Councilmen, a Coroner and Town Clerk. For municipal purposes the borough is divided into five wards—viz. Scholes, Swinley, St. George's, All Saints, and Queen Street Wards. The present Mayor is Jas. Burrows, Esq. Neither the Reform Bill of 1832 nor that of 1867 has altered the number of members returned to Parliament; but the latter increased the number of electors from 900 to 4,400. The present members are Lord Lindsay and Thomas Knowles, Esquire, who were elected in February, 1874. The magistrates hold petty sessions in the new Court House in Rodney Street, every Monday and Wednesday, at ten o'clock; and the County Magistrates also hold petty sessions for the Wigan Division, in the same building, on Fridays, at eleven o'clock. There is also a court of quarter sessions, with a recorder as judge. The ancient and interesting Parish Church is a beautiful edifice dedicated to All Saints. With the exception of the tower, the edifice was almost entirely rebuilt several years ago. The interior is ornamented by several mural tablets to the memory of deceased parishioners. The living is a rectory, in the presentation of the Earl of Bradford. The other churches of the Establishment in the town are St. George's, a plain brick building in Church Street; St. Catherine's, Birkett Bank, is a beautiful edifice with spire; St. Thomas', Caroline Street, and St. James', Poolstock, are handsome modern edifices. There are three Roman Catholic Churches, and numerous other Independent, Baptist, Methodist, Presbyterian, and other chapels of Nonconformists, which will be found in the Directory. All the Episcopal and Catholic Churches and Nonconformists have day schools in connection. The other educational establishments will be found mentioned under their proper heads.

THE NEW INFIRMARY.—The suggestion to erect a building that should combine all the advantages of a hospital with those of the existing dispensary was first made at an annual meeting of the subscribers of the present institution, held in February, 1866, the necessity for such an establishment having long been felt. The Dispensary Committee, upon enquiry, found that there would be no difficulty in the way of disposing of the premises and land belonging to the Dispensary, and appropriating the proceeds to the funds of an Infirmary, should the consent of the trustees be obtained and the right proportion of the subscribers so determine. Consent was given, and it was decided to erect an institution as soon as all necessary arrangements were completed. The subscription list shows many very handsome donations, John Lancaster, Esq., M.P., and the Wigan Coal and Iron Company, Limited, giving £3,000 each. The workpeople of the above company gave nearly £3,000; the Earl of Crawford and Balcarres and the Misses Gidlow each £2,000; Lord Lindsay, £1,000; whilst many others gave sums of £500, £300, &c. The cornerstone was laid by the Earl of Crawford and Balcarres on the 26th December, 1870, and was opened by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales. The buildings are arranged so as to front the main road from Wigan to Standish. The administrative offices and dispensary occupy the centre, right and left of which are wings for males and females, and in the rear of the offices is a two-storey pavilion for surgical or accidental cases. The ward accommodation is for 60 patients—45 males and 15 females. The buildings stand on land the most accessible and healthy in Wigan, the extent of which is 7 acres, 2 roods, 14 perches, and 30 yards, at a cost of £6,192 10s., less £300 returned as a donation by A. F. Haliburton, Esq., from whom one portion of the land was purchased. The tender (£13,032) of Mr. Joseph Wilson, of Wigan, for the building, &c., was accepted. Mr. Thos. Worthington, of Manchester,

was the architect. The Union Workhouse has accommodation for 800 inmates. It is situated on the west side of the town, in Frog Lane, and was built in 1857. The Union includes the following places:—Abram, Ashton-in-Makerfield (or Ashton-le-Willows), Aspull, Billings-Chapel-End, Billings Higher End, Blackrod, Dalton, Haigh, Hindley, Ince-in-Makerfield, Orrell, Parbold, Shevington, Standish-with-Langtree, Upholland, Wigan, Winstanley, Worthington, and Wrightington. The County Court, which is held every fortnight, has jurisdiction over a district co-extensive with the Union. The Town Hall, King street, erected at a cost of over £17,000, contains the Borough Gaol, Police and Fire Engine Stations, Sessions Courts, and other public offices. In the same street are located the Liberal Club, the Theatre Royal, and the Public Hall. The latter building contains the Mechanics' Institute, Library and News-rooms, and two large rooms adapted for concerts, balls, or public meetings. The Arcade Building, King street, is a handsome pile in the domestic Gothic style of architecture, built for Richard Leigh, Esq. solicitor. The building is entirely faced with the best Yorkshire stone, richly relieved with carving and large columns of Shap granite, and contains the following accommodation:—An arcade of shops, the Manchester and

County Bank, and several sets of fine offices. There are also buildings of recent erection which tend to ornament and improve the appearance of the town. The banking establishments in the town are the Manchester and Liverpool District Bank, the Manchester and County Bank, Parr's Banking Company, and the Savings Bank. There are two excellent newspapers published weekly (on Friday), *The Wigan Observer* and *The Wigan Examiner*, both having an excellent circulation in the town and district. The retail establishments are large, and will bear comparison with others in larger towns or cities; and the general trade of the town is in a highly flourishing state. The markets, held on Monday and Friday, are well attended, and plentifully supplied with all kinds of produce. At present the market is held in the street, but a new Market Hall is now (1876) in course of erection near the Market Place. Fairs are held on Holy Thursday, and the day before and after June 27th, October 28th, 29th, and 30th. The Wigan Union contained at the census of 1861, 94,561 inhabitants; and in 1871, 111,898. Acreage of the Union, 47,018. Valuation, £355,999. The population of the borough of Wigan, by the census of 1861, was 37,658; in 1871, 39,111. The valuation of the township of Wigan in 1871 was £90,716; acreage, 2,188.

ASHTON-IN-MAKERFIELD, or Ashton-le-Willows, is a township comprising the village of Ashton and the hamlets of Seneley Green, Downall Green, Ashton Heath, Sims Lane End, Park Lane, Lodge Lane, Edge Green and Brocstedes. There are two parishes in the township, one of which is a rectory in the gift of the Earl of Derby, and the other a vicarage in the gift of the rector of Ashton. The Right Honourable Baron Gerard, of Bryn, is lord of the manor, and owner of most of the land in the parish. Ashton is a name common to several places in the southern division of the county, as, Ashton-under-Lyne, Ashton-on-Mersey, and Ashton-on-Ribble, and they all belonged, at one time, to the family of Ashetons, who held domains extending over a large part of the country between the Ribble and Mersey, and to whom the Byrons of Rochdale, and other notable families, were vassals. The seat of the

present lords of the manor is at Garswood, but were formerly known as the Gerards of Bryn. Haydock Lodge, a beautifully situated mansion, formerly the residence of the Legh family, is now occupied as a private asylum for the reception and recovery of insane patients. The system of treatment pursued at this establishment has been highly successful. The extensive grounds for the exercise and recreation of the patients are tastefully laid out. Ashton is on the old high road from Warrington to Wigan and the north, and is five miles from the latter and seven from the former town. The line of an old Roman road is nearly coincident with the present road, and is yet traceable in various parts of the township. Ashton has long been celebrated for the manufacture of wrought hinges, locks, door handles, files, &c., &c. A local board was established on the 13th June, 1872, and a waterworks is in contemplation. There are

also many extensive collieries in the township, and a grammar school at Seneley Green, with an endowment of £43. The population in 1851 was 5,679, in 1861, 6,566, and in 1871, 7,463; females, 3,490; males, 3,973. Acreage, 6,349; valuation, £44,067.

ASPULL is a township having an area of 1,879 acres, and in 1861 its population was 4,290, in 1871, 6,390; valuation £20,354; acreage 1,905. It contains the village of Aspull, Aspull Moor, Dicconson Mill, and Pennington Green. Aspull Moor, as its name implies, was formerly an open common, but its limits are gradually being reduced by coal pits and buildings. The Wigan Coal & Iron Co., are the principal coal owners and have extensive workshops at New Springs, Messrs. William Woods & Son (Henry Woods, Esq., &c.), have also cannel pits in the township. Branch lines of railway to the various collieries from the main lines intersect the township. Lord Kingsdown built a church at Pennington Green in 1859. A neat iron church has also been erected at New Springs, in the midst of an increasing population, and the Roman Catholics, Wesleyans, and Independents have also places of worship in the township.

BILLINGE—CHAPEL-END and **BILLINGE HIGHER-END**—are townships in the Wigan union. The former is about five miles from Wigan, and the same from St. Helens. In 1861 the population was 2,015, and in 1871, 1,961; the acreage, 1,161; and the valuation, £4,072.

BILLINGE—HIGHER-END is about three miles from Wigan, convenient to Orrell Station, on the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway. The population in 1861 was 1,051; and in 1871, 1,267. Acreage, 1,571; valuation, £3,643. Sir Robert T. Gerard, Baronet, of Garswood, and Meyrick Bankes, Esq., of Winstanley Hall, own most of the land, the latter being lord of the manor. Bispham Hall, in Higher-End, is the residence of W. H. Brancker, Esq. The church is a plain, substantial building, the living being in the gift of the rector of Wigan. A bequest of John Eddleston, dating from 1672, partly supports a national school here. There is a Roman Catholic Chapel, dedicated to St. Mary, the foundation stone of which was laid in 1826, and opened on the 12th May, 1828. Sir William Gerard, Bart, contributed £1,000, and gave the site. The schools in connection were built in 1858, at a cost of £2,300. The coal mines are worked to a limited extent; nail making is also carried on, and the quarrying and working of excellent building stones gives employment to a portion of the population. Billinge is situated on elevated ground occupying the southern end of the

ridge, of which Dalton is the northern, and there is here also a building on the highest point—Billinge Beacon—which like Ashurst Beacon, is used as a sea mark. The two beacons are about five miles distant from each other, and to the west of the ridge lies the plain that stretches from the Mersey to the Ribble, and over which vessels on the Irish Sea can be plainly distinguished. The nearer view from Billinge includes the extensive woods that surround Lathom House, the Knowsley woods, Bickerstaffe Church, and Ormskirk. Eastward the view includes Rivington Pike, Haigh Hall, Wigan, Leigh, Bowdon, and the hills of Derbyshire and North-East Lancashire, and on rare occasions the hills in Shropshire are seen across the Cheeshire plain.

BLACKROD is a township and village in the union and county court district of Wigan, from which it is distant about five miles by road, and seven by the new railway route via Hindley and Dicconson Mill. It is over seven miles from Bolton, of which it forms a part of the parish, it has a church of which the living is in the gift of the vicar of Bolton. It is in the rural deanery of Bolton, the diocese of Manchester, and the hundred of Salford. It lies near the line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway from Bolton to Preston. The Leeds and Liverpool Canal passes at a little distance to the north. In the township are numerous productive collieries, each connected with the main line of railway by branches. There is a grammar school, whose income of £266 includes an exhibition to Pembroke College, Cambridge. There are large charities, a school supported by the Earl of Crawford, and a national school. The church is dedicated to St. Catherine, and there is a Wesleyan Chapel. There is a fair held on the 12th of July. The line of a Roman road is traceable in the township, and there is every probability that here was a Roman station named Coccium in the *Iter* of Antonius, on the military

road from Mancunium (Manchester) to the north. The population in 1861 was 3,214; and in 1871, 3,796. Valuation, £11,805. The area is 238 statute acres. Works have been recently established by a company for supplying the residents with gas. The land owners are the Earl of Crawford and Balcarres, Roger Leigh, Esq., and the Marquis de Bothwell.

Wigan townspeople. The Haigh Foundry Company's Works, turn out castings of the heaviest kinds, and also bar iron, spades, picks, &c., which the trade of the district requires. HINDLEY, HINDLEY GREEN, PLATT BRIDGE, & LOW GREEN.

HINDLEY, a township and parish, has a station on the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, three miles from Wigan and seven from Bolton. It is in the deanery of Warrington, the archdeaconry of Liverpool, and the diocese of Chester, and south-west division of the county. It was formerly a single street, forming the road from Bolton to Wigan, but it has recently greatly extended in other directions. Extensive sanitary improvements are at present actively carried out by the Local Board of Health. It is stated that only four churches were consecrated in South Lancashire from 1660 to 1717, one of these being at Hindley. The present edifice (All Saints), however, dates from 1766, and there is a new church dedicated to St. Peter, erected in 1864. The registers date from 1689. The living is in the gift of the rector of Wigan. There are various congregations of Nonconformists, several of which have schools in connection. There are charities to the value of £85 distributed annually. There is a successful co-operative store, connected with which is a newsroom and library, and a commodious hall, used for public meetings, lectures, &c. There are several cotton mills and many collieries in the district. The Earl of Ellesmere, Sir Humphrey de Trafford, Roger Leigh, Esq., Messrs. Hargreaves, and J. Walmsley, Esq., are the chief landowners. The area is 2,611 acres; and the population in 1861 was 8,477; 1871, 10,627.

HINDLEY GREEN and **PLATT BRIDGE** are hamlets, each having a station on the Wigan and Tyldesley Railway. The former is about 1½ miles S.E., and the latter the same distance S.W. from Hindley.

LOW GREEN adjoins Platt Bridge.

ORRELL is a township and village three miles west from Wigan. It is in the South-Western division of the county, and the parish and union of Wigan. There is a school-church belonging to the Established church, and various Dissenting chapels. There was formerly a nunnery here, the grounds of which form gardens now much resorted to. Coal is found abundantly in the township. There is a cotton mill, and screw bolt and nailmaking is carried on here. There is a small charity distributed annually to the poor of Orrell, the interest of £100, left by James Thomason in 1730. The chief landowners are the successor of Lord Kingsdown and Meyrick Bankes, Esq. There is a station on the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway from Manchester to Liverpool. The acreage is 1,618; valuation, £26,606. The population in 1861 was 2,932, and in 1871, 3,561.

PEMBERTON.

PEMBERTON is a very extensive township west of and adjoining the borough of Wigan, from which it is separated by the River Douglas. It comprises the villages of Lamberhead Green, Newtown, Goose Green, Kitt Green, Worsley Mesnes, and Smithy Brook, the first of which is the most important, and is three miles from Wigan. It has a mechanics' institution, and shows other signs of intellectual activity. The church of St. John is a plain brick edifice; the living is a vicarage, in the presentation of the rector of Wigan. There are many schools in the township, also chapels belonging to various denominations. The Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway passes through the township, and there is a station. There are several collieries and stone quarries; at Newtown are cotton mills, oil, manure, and iron works. Though the township is very populous the supply of water is precarious, but one well at Lamberhead Green (Pingate) is noted for its excellent quality. Hawkey hall is an old timbered building, now used as a farmhouse. Pemberton is in the hundred of West Derby (with which now is co-extensive the south-western division of the county), the rural Deanery of Warrington, and the archdeaconry of Liverpool. STANDISH.

STANDISH is a large township and parish in the hundred of Leyland and Northern division of Lancashire. The parish includes the townships of Standish-with-Langtree, Shevington, and Worthington. The village of Standish is three miles n.n.w. from Wigan. There is a church dating from the reign of Elizabeth, erected by Pastor Moodie, the first Protestant rector, who had been a Franciscan friar, and to whom a monument exists in the church. The living, which is a valuable one, is held by the Rev. Canon Brandreth, who resides at the rectory, near the village. Standish Hall, formerly the seat of the lords of the manor—the Standish family—is now in the occupation of Nathaniel Eckersley Esq., J.P. It is surrounded by a beautiful park and woods. Coal is worked throughout the parish. There is a paper mill, and the Wigan Waterworks are in the parish;

also a Grammar school and a National school. Standish is a station on the Warrington and Preston railway. The population of the township in 1861 was 3,054, and in 1871, 3,698; the area, 2,364; valuation, £19,358. The old Roman road from Wigan northwards passes through, and a few Roman relics have been found here.
