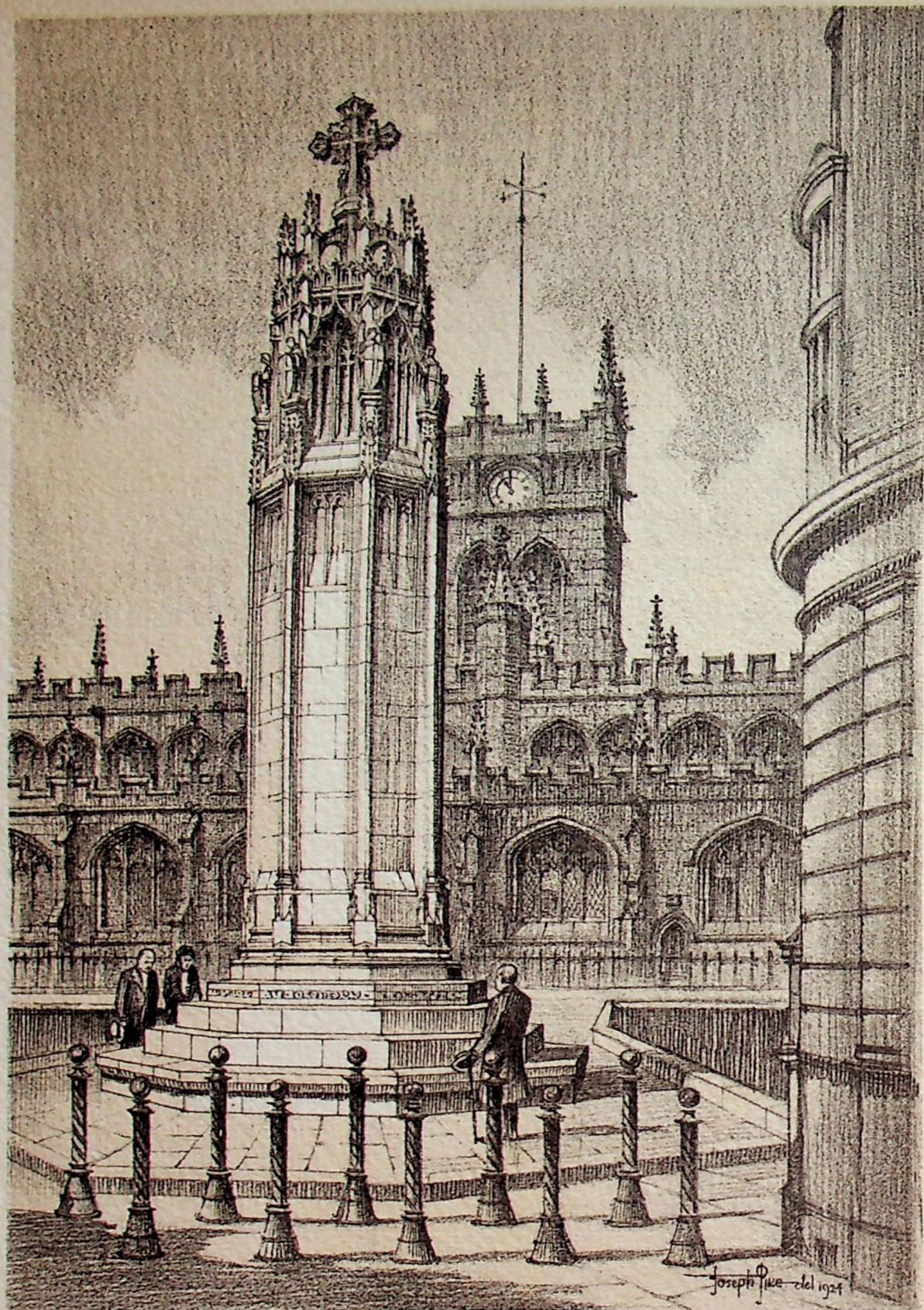

*When all are in their places the Worshipful the Mayor of Wigan
(Councillor Thomas Holland, M.B.E., J.P.), shall say:—*

We are come to honour our brethren who gave their lives for us and this Country in a just cause. This Memorial is the witness of our love for their memory ; and the constant pledge and reminder to us of their valour and our duty.

In the unavoidable absence of the Right Hon. The Earl of Crawford and Balcarres, K.T., I call upon Mr. Ainscough, the Chairman of the War Memorial Committee, to read a letter received from Lord Crawford.

Then shall the Chairman of the War Memorial Committee (Mr. J. M. Ainscough, J.P.) read the letter, and afterwards he shall request General The Hon. Sir Herbert Alexander Lawrence, K.C.B., to proceed to the Unveiling, saying:—

Sir, I desire you to unveil this Memorial.

General The Hon. Sir Herbert Alexander Lawrence, K.C.B., shall deliver an Address to the people, after which he shall unveil the Memorial.

The General Salute will then be given by the Guard of Honour.

At the conclusion of the General Salute the Choir shall sing the Anthem:—

GIVE rest, O Christ, to thy servants with thy
Saints ; where sorrow and pain are no more ;
neither sighing, but life everlasting.

(Setting by C. H. Moody, C.B.E., Mus. D.,
Sometime Organist of Wigan Parish Church.)

Then shall the Rev. T. L. Davies, B.A. (Free Church Chaplain), read the following Lesson from Revelation XXI:—

AND I saw a new heaven and a new earth : for the first heaven and the first earth are passed away ; and the sea is no more. And I saw the holy city, New Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, made ready as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a great voice out of the throne saying, Behold the tabernacle of God is with men, and he shall dwell with them, and they shall be his peoples, and God himself shall be with them, and be their God : and he shall wipe away every tear from their eyes ; and death shall be no more ; neither shall their be mourning, nor crying, nor pain, any more ; for the former things are passed away. And he that sitteth on the throne said, Behold, I make all things new. And he saith, Write : for these words are faithful and true. And he said unto me, They are come to pass. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. I will give unto him that is athirst of the fountain of the water of life freely. He that overcometh shall inherit these things ; and I will be his God, and he shall be my son.

We are assembled here this afternoon to perform a solemn duty and to fulfil an obligation which has been too long delayed. An obligation to place in some conspicuous position a permanent tangible memorial of those of our townsmen who gave their lives in the great struggle of 1914-1918 that we might have peace and security. After long and anxious deliberation it was decided to place the memorial on this site in the very centre and heart of our town. This is indeed sacred ground, hallowed for nearly a thousand years as the last resting place of those generations of our townsmen who have gone before us. Here, then, we have raised on high the crowned cross alike the symbol of sacrifice and of victory. On these stones we have carved the names not of those who distinguished themselves in the fight, nor of that great number who, we thank God, returned unscathed, (many of whom are with us today,) but the names of nearly 1,800 of our fellow townsmen who went out in the vigour of youth and strength never to return. I trust then that in the future our people will approach this spot with even greater reverence than in the past, and that this Memorial itself may never be defiled by any sacrilegious hands.

We had earnestly hoped to have with us today the Earl of Crawford & Balcarres and I am sure it will be regretted by all present that an earlier engagement in the City of Oxford has prevented that. Through the long association of his family with the town, by his own personal sacrifice in providing hospital accommodation and equipment, by the noble example he set to others in his enlistment as a private soldier and by the exalted position he occupies in the realms of art and literature he stands out pre-eminently as the one we would all have liked to perform the duty which has fallen to my lot this afternoon.

~~worrying~~ We have from him, however, a letter which instead of ~~worrying~~ you with any further observations of my own, I propose to read to you as it is couched in language more worthy of this solemn occasion than any I could hope to employ. *In a letter to the Town Clerk &c*

" Though long years have elapsed since the loss of those we commemorate, yet our memory has never failed them, and today we take final steps to ensure that here in the centre of our township the Memorial shall ever be prominent before our eyes, beside the crowded market-place, overlooking our busiest

thoroughfare, and with the famous old Church as its background. We have rightly caused the monument to be enshrined in the very heart of the Borough, just as their achievement must reflect the most treasured witness of our affection and respect. The appeal is widespread. There can be few from whom the monument does not ask for a response in recalling some personal loss; alas ! that these sorrows should be so universal, but we can all proudly say that the Death-roll of our troops is the Roll of Honour of our Race. If thousands perished, tens of thousands were ready to do the same.

Yet, we must have lost the flower of our Nation. It was in the hideous circumstances of those tragic years that our most poignant grief was aroused. The conditions of war seem to have assumed their most sordid and cruel aspect; most of our troops were immobile, immured in their trenches, harassed by suffering and illness bred by their harsh surroundings, and deprived of the stimulating movement which is at least a

compensating feature of active warfare.

Notwithstanding these trials, the intensity of which our imagination will never picture, the British Army gained a well-earned reputation for cheerfulness amidst all these horrors. Their good humour never seemed to wane.

And sterner qualities emerged which our critics had vainly imagined were no longer the ornament of our people:- personal gallantry of course, acts of individual heroism, feats of strength and endurance, examples of splendid self-sacrifice. These there were in plenty, and every unit can display its honourable record of prowess. But the army as a whole, in every seat of war, and in every branch of the service, was no less distinguished for a singleness of purpose; for modesty in moments of triumph, as well as for whole-hearted discipline in times of distress. Little wonder that our soldiers should have earned the respect of all, whether friend or foe, with whom they came into contact.

Here at home after all these years, we may meet re-actions and impatiences, a sense of disillusionment that high hopes and aspirations have been but ill realised. The dislocations, indeed the catastrophes of the greatest war in history are not lightly or soon removed. Unknown heroes perished, unknown genius was cut off before its prime; the incalculable scale of our loss we shall never know. Yet it is not all sorrow.

" even through the hollow eyes of Death I spy life peering; but I dare not say How near the tidings of our comfort is."

Let us rejoice that we possess their fame and cherish their memory. Let us profit by the inspiration of their character and patriotism. Remember the men of Wigan who gave their lives in the Great War." *Yours faithfully C.M.D.*

And now Sir Herbert Lawrence we are grateful to you for so readily acceding to our request to perform this Ceremony. It may have occurred to you to wonder why we so keenly desired your presence. The reason is not far to seek. A preponderating number of those whose names are engraved on this Memorial belonged to

the 5th Bn. The Manchester Regiment. The bones of many of them lie on the arid slopes of the Gallipoli Peninsula where they were under your immediate command. Again they came under your observation in France where you commanded the 36th Division in which they were included. You saw them fight. You saw them die. In those dark days they were inspired by your words of encouragement and commendation, and it was the earnest wish of the survivors (many of whom you see around you) that you should be with us today. Of your own sacrifice and bereavement I will not presume to speak.

Your family ^{has} ~~have~~ ever been conspicuous in the service of their Country, more especially your illustrious Uncle, Sir Henry Lawrence, and your still more distinguished father, Lord Lawrence. The story of their deeds illuminates one of the darkest pages in the history of our Indian Empire and will be remembered with pride so long as that Empire survives.

The industries of this Nation are at present under a dark cloud. The extent of unemployment in this immediate district is unprecedented. At the solicitation of the Government you have come forward

to enquire into the condition of one of our key industries one in which we in wigan are deeply interested. May God's blessing rest upon you and your colleagues on this enquiry, and may the result of it be such as will tend to ameliorate the conditions under which so great a number of our population at the present time are living.

On behalf of the War Memorial Committee representing the general body of inhabitants of this town, I desire you, Sir, to unveil this Memorial.

Then shall the Chairman of the War Memorial Committee request the Lord Bishop of Liverpool to dedicate the Memorial, saying:—

My Lord, we request you as Bishop of this Diocese, to dedicate this Memorial in the Name of God, and in thankful and glorious memory of our townsmen who gave their lives in the great War.

And the Bishop shall say:—

The Lord be with you.

Answer: And with thy Spirit.

Let us pray.

The Collect of Dedication.

ALMIGHTY Father, who for us men and for our salvation, sparedst not but didst give thine only begotten Son, accept, we beseech thee and bless this Memorial which we here dedicate to the honour of thy Majesty; that as thou didst make him perfect through sufferings and hast now exalted him to thy right hand, so we may ever keep in remembrance those of this town who, after his example, laid down their lives for their friends; and following their faithfulness, may with them attain to thy Kingdom in glory; through the merits of the same thy Son, Jesus Christ, who with thee and the Holy Ghost liveth and reigneth, ever one God, world without end, *Amen.*

After this the LAST POST shall be sounded.

There shall a silence be kept by the space of two minutes, and then

THE REVEILLE.

The Anglican Chaplain (The Rev. C. C. Thicknesse, M.A., Rector of Wigan), shall say:—

Let us pray.

O ETERNAL Lord God, who holdest all souls in life; we beseech thee to shed forth upon thy whole Church in Paradise and on earth, the bright beams of thy light and heavenly comfort; and grant that we, following the good example of those who have loved and served thee here and are now at rest, may with them at length enter into the fulness of thine unending joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

The Free Church Chaplain (Rev. W. A. Thomson), shall say:—

WE beseech thee, O Father, to whom all live, knit us together in thy love; keep alive in our hearts the memory of those who have gone before us; comfort them that mourn; and preserve our homes in peace; that thy servants may serve thee with a glad mind, and work together in faith until the day of the general resurrection, when thou shalt gather thine elect into thine eternal home; through him, who hath overcome death, and opened unto us the gate of everlasting life, thy Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord,
Amen.

Then shall all the people join and say:—

OUR Father, which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name. Thy Kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, As it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation: But deliver us from evil: For thine is the Kingdom, The power and the glory, For ever and ever. *Amen.*

Then shall the Bishop bless the people.

And this hymn shall be sung :—

THROUGH the night of doubt and sorrow
Onward goes the pilgrim band,
Singing songs of expectation,
Marching to the Promised Land.
Clear before us through the darkness
Gleams and burns the guiding light ;
Brother clasps the hand of brother,
Stepping fearless through the night.
One the light of God's own presence
O'er his ransomed people shed,
Chasing far the gloom and terror,
Brightening all the path we tread ;
One the object of our journey,
One the faith which never tires,
One the earnest looking forward,
One the hope our God inspires :
One the strain that lips of thousands
Lift as from the heart of one ;
One the conflict, one the peril,
One the march in God begun ;
One the gladness of rejoicing
On the far eternal shore,
Where the One Almighty Father
Reigns in love for evermore.
Onward, therefore, pilgrim brothers,
Onward with the Cross our aid ;
Bear its shame, and fight its battle,
Till we rest beneath its shade.
Soon shall come the great awaking,
Soon the rending of the tomb ;
Then the scattering of all shadows,

Then shall the Chairman of the War Memorial Committee say to the Mayor :—

Your Worship, on behalf of the Committee responsible for the erection of this Memorial we hand to you our finished work : It is your part, Sir, to accept, in the name of this County Borough of Wigan, the care and preservation in perpetuity of this tribute to the undying glory of our Sons and Brothers.

And the Mayor shall answer on behalf of the Community :—

The trust is ours ; and it shall be kept :
God and this people are witness.

And all the people shall say :— AMEN.

Then shall all sing :—

PRAISE God, from whom all blessings flow,
Praise him, all creatures here below,
Praise him above, ye heavenly host,
Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.

*The Royal Salute shall then be given by the Guard of Honour ;
the Band of the 5th Battalion The Manchester Regiment shall play
and the people shall sing :—*

GOD save our gracious King,
Long live our noble King,
God save the King !
Send him victorious,
Happy and glorious,
Long to reign over us ;
God save the King !

The bells of the Parish Church shall peal.

*The Mayor shall lay a wreath on the Memorial, and then the official
wreaths shall be laid on the Memorial*

The Mayor and civic procession headed by the 5th Battalion Manchester Regiment and the Ex-Service Men, shall move to the Town Hall where they will disperse.

After the Mayoral procession has left the War Memorial site, the relatives of the men who are commemorated, walking in procession from the south, shall inspect the Memorial and the Tablets, after which the rest of the people shall be admitted into All Saints' Gardens for the purpose of inspecting the Memorial.

DESCRIPTION OF THE WAR MEMORIAL.

The Memorial is designed on the lines of the old Eleanor Crosses. This, however, is only a matter of general character and feeling, and the design is not reminiscent of any particular ancient example. The Memorial is octagonal in plan. The lowest member of the base consists of a seat. Immediately above this are panels containing the names of the fallen, these forming with three steps above, a bold base upon which stands the shaft of the monument itself.

At each of the eight corners of this shaft are small buttresses, with moulded bases, terminating at the top in crocketed pinnacles.

The upper portion of the shaft is richer and more delicate in treatment. Above the pinnacles alluded to are placed angels, eight in number, bearing wreaths, symbolical of Victory. The shaft at the level of these angels is treated with pierced tracery, surmounted by a cresting; above which rises the Cross, forming the apex of the monument: supported by flying buttresses. The Cross is enriched with tracery, and has carved crowns forming the termination of the arms. Two small figures of angels flank the stem of the Cross itself.

The whole of the Memorial is carried out in Clipsham Stone, with the exception of the panels for the names, which are in Hopton Wood Marble.

The principal dimensions of the Memorial are as follows:—

Diameter of shaft	6ft. 9in.
Diameter of spreading base	22ft. 0in.
Total height from ground to top of Cross	44ft. 0in.

A print of a drawing of the War Memorial is contained on the inside of the cover of this Order of Service.

Since this drawing was made by Mr. Joseph Pike, the design of the War Memorial has been slightly modified so as to enable 40 tablets in Hopton Wood Marble to be erected at the base of the Memorial. The names of the men commemorated, almost 1,800 in number, are inscribed upon these tablets.

The Memorial was designed by Sir Giles Gilbert Scott, R.A., and was erected by Mr. Edward Owen Griffith, Sculptor and Architectural Carver, of Liverpool.

INSCRIPTIONS ON THE WAR MEMORIAL.

On the southern face (opposite Wallgate) of the War Memorial, the following words are carved :—

REMEMBER THE MEN OF WIGAN WHO GAVE
THEIR LIVES IN THE GREAT WAR, 1914-1918.

On that side of the War Memorial facing the Parish Church the following words are carved :—

A GOOD LIFE HATH BUT FEW DAYS:
BUT A GOOD NAME ENDURETH FOR EVER.
