

ORDINANCE NO. 20

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THE UNIFORM WIDTH FOR THE STREETS
IN ALBA BOROUGH.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and the
Town Council of Alba Borough, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby
enacted and ordained by the authority of the same:

1st: That all streets in the Borough of Alba be widened
to a uniform width of forty-five (45) feet, being twenty-two
and one-half ($22\frac{1}{2}$) feet each side of the center line of the
respective streets.

2nd: That all lands necessary to be taken for the widen-
ing of the said streets be and the same are hereby appropriated
for said purposes.

3rd: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent
herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.
