## **COMPLEX SENTENCES 1: ADJECTIVAL AND ADVERBIAL CLAUSES**

# JOWN A WRUG DALLATH DESKY KERNOWEK

### ADJECTIVAL – relative clause

Direct – antecedent is subject of clause verb Affirmative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek, **a vedha meur y brow dhodho** John began to learn Cornish, which would be very useful for him

Direct – antecedent is subject of clause verb Negative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek, **nag o gwaityans den vëth** John began to learn Cornish, which was not what anyone expected

Direct – antecedent is direct object of clause verb Affirmative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek, **a dhôwysas ev in mes a showr a hobbys possybyl** John began to learn Cornish, which he chose out of a whole lot of possible hobbies

Direct – antecedent is direct object of clause verb Negative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek, **na gafas cales wàr neb cor** John began to learn Cornish, which he didn't find difficult at all

Indirect – antecedent is neither subject nor direct object of clause verb Affirmative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek, **mayth o porposys dhe wil mêstry anodho** John began to learn Cornish, which he intended to master thoroughly

*Indirect – antecedent is neither subject nor direct object of clause verb Negative* 

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek, **ma nag esa ger vëth anodho godhvedhys ganso kyns** John began to learn Cornish, which he didn't yet know a word of

#### ADJECTIVAL – indirect relative clause of place

Antecedent Affirmative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **i'n dre, mayth esa tregys** John began to learn Cornish in the town where he lived

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No antecedent Affirmative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek, **le ma wrug ev gobrena ranjy** John began to learn Cornish where he had rented a flat

Antecedent Negative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **in treveglos, ma nag esa Kernowegor vëth** John began to learn Cornish in a village where there wasn't a single Cornish speaker

No antecedent Negative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek, **le nag esa den aral vëth whensys dhe wil** John began to learn Cornish where no one else wanted to do that

### ADJECTIVAL – indirect relative clause of time

Antecedent Affirmative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **i'n vledhen, may kemeras ev soodh in Kernow** John began to learn Cornish in the year when he got a job in Cornwall

No antecedent Affirmative – use temporal pàn clause instead (see below)

Antecedent Negative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **i'n ourys, ma nag esa ken ober dhodho** John began to learn Cornish in the hours when he didn't have anything else to do

No antecedent Negative – use temporal pàn na clause istead (see below)

# **ADVERBIAL** - Temporal

When Affirmative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **pàn êth in remôcyon dhe Gernow** John began to learn Cornish when he moved to Cornwall

When Negative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **pàn na spêdyas ev in y apposyans Frynkek** John began to learn Cornish when he failed his French exam

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As soon as Affirmative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **kettel dheuth ev dhe Benzans** John began to learn Cornish as soon as he came to Penzance Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **peskytter may feu chauns dhodho** John began to learn Cornish as soon as he had the chance

# As soon as

## Negative

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **kettel na ylly mos in mes a'n chy na felha** John began to learn Cornish as soon as he couldn't get out of the house any more

## Until

# Affirmative

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **erna gafas ev hobba aral** John began to learn Cornish until he got another hobby Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **bys may feuva frôsek y gows** John began to learn Cornish until he could speak it fluently Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **bys pàn ylly gwil apposyans an Kensa Level** John began to learn Cornish until he could sit the First Level exam

## Until

### Negative

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **bys na veu an tavas dhe les dhodho namoy** John began to learn Cornish until the language was no more use to him Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **bys pàn nag esa carores a Gernow dhodho na felha** John began to learn Cornish until he didn't have a Cornish girlfriend any more

# Before

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **kyns trailya dhe'n Kembrek in y le** John began to learn Cornish before turning to Welsh instead Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **kyns ès prena chy in Porth Ia** John began to learn Cornish before buying a house in St Ives Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **kyns ès ev dhe gonvedhes pygebmys caletter eus ino** John began to learn Cornish before he understood how hard it is Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **kyns ès dell erviras ev desky Bretonek magata** John began to learn Cornish before he decided to learn Breton as well

# After

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **wosa assaya an Wordhonek** John began to learn Cornish after trying Irish Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **wosa ev dhe omdedna** John began to learn Cornish after he retired Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **warlergh dos dhe Gambron** John began to learn Cornish after coming to Camborne Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **warlergh ev dhe whythra studh an tavas dasvêwys** John began to learn Cornish after he had investigated the situation of the revived language

# Since

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **abàn veusta in Trûrû an dewetha tro** John **had begun** to learn Cornish since he was last in Truro

## ADVERBIAL – Causal

#### Since

Affirmative

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **abàn esa otham a jalynj nowyth dhodho** John began to learn Cornish since he needed a fresh challenge

## Since

### Negative

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **abàn nag esa class dhe gafos in Italyan** John began to learn Cornish since there no Italian class was available

## Because

#### Affirmative

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **awos otham dhe vos dhodho a'n tavas in y soodh** John began to learn Cornish because he needed the language in his job Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **awos bos class Kernowek in y dre** John began to learn Cornish because there was a Cornish class in his town Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **drefen ev dhe gemeres les i'n ertach a Gernow** John began to learn Cornish because he was interested in Cornish heritage Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **drefen y vos ow cara gonysegeth Keltek** John began to learn Cornish because he loved Celtic culture Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **rag y gothman dhe vos ow tesky an tavas solabrÿs** John began to learn Cornish because his friend was already learning the language Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **rag y feu pobel hegar i'n class** John began to learn Cornish because there were nice people in the class

#### Because

#### Negative

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **drefen na wodhya convedhes styr henwyn tyleryow** John began to learn Cornish because he couldn't understand the meanings of place-names Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **rag nag esa dhodho escaruster vëth wàr y bydn** John began to learn Cornish because he wasn't hostile to it at all Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **rag nyns yw mar gales avell Kembrek** John began to learn Cornish because it isn't as difficult as Welsh

### ADVERBIAL – Concessive

Although Affirmative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **kynth o va Sows genys in Loundres** John began to learn Cornish although he was an Englishman born in London

Although Negative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **kyn nag o va den a Gernow hy honen** John began to learn Cornish although he was not from Cornwall itself

Even though Affirmative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **ha kynth yw an tavas nebes complek** John began to learn Cornish even though the language is quite complex

Even though Negative Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **ha kyn nag eus lies cowsor anodho** John began to learn Cornish even though it doesn't have many speakers

# ADVERBIAL – Purpose

#### Affirmative

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **rag gwelhe y vêwnans socyal** John began to learn Cornish in order to improve his social life Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **rag may halla gwainya cothmans nowyth** John began to learn Cornish in order that he might make new friends

Negative

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **rag na ve sogh y skentoleth** John began to learn Cornish in order that his mind should not grow dull

## ADVERBIAL – Result

#### Affirmative

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek, **mayth o va bysy pùb gordhuwher** John began to learn Cornish, so that he was busy every evening

# Negative

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek, **ma nag esa dhodho mynysen frank mo ha myttyn** John began to learn Cornish, so that he didn't have a free moment from dawn till dusk

# ADVERBIAL – Without

Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **heb jùnya dhe glass vëth** John began to learn Cornish without joining any class Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek **heb y wreg dhe wodhvos hedna** John began to learn Cornish without his wife knowing it Jowan a wrug dallath desky Kernowek, **ma nag esa otham dhodho a dhescador** John began to learn Cornish without needing a teacher
