#### **WORKSHEET 2**

### Academic year 2024/5, Course to CEFR Level A2

In **Lesson Two** of *Cara Kernowek Book Two* there is a lot of information about using words for 'what', 'which', 'where'. Read it through carefully.

In class we shall be asking each other questions. Here is some preparation you should do in advance.

## 1. 'What' – pana or pan

Make sure you pronounce pan with a long vowel. Distinguish pan 'when' (short vowel). Be ready to ask fellow students what places / food / TV programmes / films they like, what smartphone they use, what car they drive, what languages they speak.

# 2. 'Which' – py

Be ready to ask fellow students which energy provider (provior nerth) they use, which candidate for Tory leader (ombrofyor humbrank an Mentênours) they think will win, which candidate for US president (ombrofyor dhe Arlewydhieth an Stâtys Udnys) they prefer.

### 3. 'Where'

Be ready to imagine a crowded room – too noisy for easy conversation. Someone says where something is, something happens, etc, but you don't catch the place. What will you say to get it repeated?

#### 4. 'Where'

Be ready to ask fellow students where they live, where they were born, where they went on holiday recently.

#### 5. 'Which one'

Be ready to imagine a shop selling pasties where they always speak Cornish at the counter unless you make clear you only speak English. (Unfortunately, not currently a business model any proprietor seems able / willing to risk!) You ask (in Cornish) for a pasty without realizing the shop sells them with various fillings. First imagine there are only two different kinds available. How might the shop assistant ask you to clarify your request? Now imagine there are three different kinds of pasty available. Again, how might the shop assistant ask you to clarify your request?
