The sole purpose of the fair is to encourage the development of arts and crafts, home arts, gardening, livestock, etc. The Harvest Fair Board consists of volunteers who work year round for no gain other than the personal satisfaction of staging a community fair. We would appreciate your assistance in making the fair a success.

Complete entry forms, and correct entry fees must be in the hands of the Williams Lake Harvest Fair as follows:

Please note: When utilizing drop-off points, please have your entry form, applicable entry fees and exhibitors fees in a sealed envelope addressed to the Williams Lake Harvest Fair. Drop-off points will not make change, nor provide receipts.

After 4:00 pm Wednesday, Sept. 3, 2025, bring entry forms to the CURLING CLUB HARVEST FAIR OFFICE between the hours of 4:00 pm and 7:00 pm.

LATE ENTRY FORMS: will be accepted Sept. 4, 2025 Thurs in Sections A-O; up until 4:00pm at the Curling Club Harvest Fair Office, at double the normal entry fee, per exhibit.





GENERAL RULES for EXHIBITORS

ENTRIES:

- 1 Unlimited entries allowed unless otherwise stated.
- 2 Entry fees will be \$0.50 per entry, unless otherwise stated in section.
- 3 Prize money will be: 1st \$2.00, 2nd \$1.50, 3rd \$1.00, unless otherwise stated.
- 4 Prize money must be picked up in person Sunday afternoon prior to the close of the fair. Any prize money remaining will revert to the Williams Lake Harvest Fair. Prize money will be available at 4:00pm, Sept 7, 2025
- 5 Entry fees will not be refunded for exhibits not entered, except where specifically stated.
- 6 Entries must not have been exhibited at the Williams Lake Harvest Fair in previous years.
- 7 All entries must be the work of the exhibitor. Exhibitor's name must not appear on any exhibit, or must be appropriately covered.
- 8 Entries entered in wrong classes will be disqualified at time of judging.
- 9 Please read the rules at the beginning of each section that you enter.
- 10 All exhibits, except for entries in Sections N and O, must be brought to the exhibit building Curling Rink, and arranged between the hours of 12:00 pm and 5:00 pm Friday, Sept 5, 2025. Any exhibitor with more than 20 entries must start arranging before 4:00 pm.

Section J-Quilting must be brought to the Curling Club between 9:00 and 3:00 pm Sept 5, 2025

- 11 Exhibits must be left until 4:00 pm, Sunday, September 7, 2025. Any article or display left in the building or on the ground after the close of the fair is left at the owner's risk.
- 12 Exhibits shall not be priced or sold while on display.

JUDGING:

- 13 Judging of exhibits in Sections A O will commence 6:00 pm, Friday, Sept 5, 2025 and continue on Saturday until 9:00 am. The public is barred from the exhibit building - Curling Rink, during judging.
- 14 Points awarded are: 1st 3 points, 2nd 2 points, 3rd 1 point.
- 15 Fruits, flowers and vegetables must be correctly named in variety or points will be lost. It will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to enter variety names on the entry tags when the entry tags are picked up on Firday, Sept 5, 2025.

GENERAL INFORMATION for EXHIBITORS

- All fruits, field crops, vegetables and domestic science will be judged according to the Standards of Perfection as issued by the BC Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food.
 Information may be obtained from the BC Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food Department, 300-640 Borland Street, Williams Lake, BC
- 17 In the absence of competition in any class, judges will give only such prizes as they deem worthy, or no prize at all. After the completion of judging, all entry tags will be opened.
- 18 Should there arise any dispute not governed in the bylaws or rules and regulations of the Williams Lake Harvest Fair, it shall be referred to the Williams Lake Harvest Fair Association Board, whose decision shall be final. All protests and appeals must be lodged with the Secretary in writing and accompanied by a \$10.00 deposit by 1:00pm on the last day of the fair. If the complaint is upheld, the deposit will be refunded.

GRAND AGGREGATE RULES:

- 19 Groups, clubs or associations are not eligible to win the Grand Aggregate Trophy.
- 20 The Grand Aggregate Trophy goes to the individual with the greatest number of total points (individuals must enter using the same name in three or more sections to be eligible)

MISCELLANEOUS:

- 21 Every care will be taken with the exhibits, however, the Harvest Fair Board will not be liable for the loss to any exhibitor occasioned by fire, theft, accident, condition or structure, or by the negligence of other officials, spectators or otherwise howsoever.
- 22 No claim for injury to any person or property shall be asserted of suit instituted, or maintained against the Williams Lake Harvest Fair Board or their agents by, or on behalf of, any visitor, and/or person, form or corporation or their agents, representatives, servants or employees having license, privilege, to visit or exhibit on the grounds or the fair or occupying any space thereon.
- 23 The Williams Lake Harvest Fair reserves the right to refuse anyone entry.
- 24 In case there are insufficient funds to pay prizes in full, they will be paid prorate.
- 25 **AMATEUR**: One who pursues his/her interest for pleasure & enjoyment only & not for monetary gains.

QUILTING STANDARDS

OVERALL APPEARANCE, DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION

Regardless of the type of guilt, the workmanship and construction techniques should be suitable to the function of the quilt. Whether using traditional or innovative construction techniques, they should be well executed.

The Quilt should:

*have visual impact.

*have unity.

*be well executed with special attention paid to overall construction.

*have materials that are suitable to its design and function.

*have appropriate embellishments.

*lay/hang flat or as appropriate for design.

*be neat, clean and odour-free.

QUILTS USING TRADITIONAL TECHNIQUES:

Definition: Quilt (technically traditional) made with two layers of fabric with a fill/batting.

Seams:

*Construction should be smooth and well stitched.

- *seams should be cleanly pressed with no thread showing. Piecing:
- *points should be sharp.

*intersections should meet evenly and be flat.

*Curves should be smooth.

Applique:

*edges should be finished smoothly with consistent stitches, hidden if intended.

Filler/Batting:

*should be evenly distributed.

Border and Sashing Strips:

*should be straight and even if appropriate to guilt design. Quilting and other traditional means of joining: *stitching should be uniform and evenly spaced; no knots or thread build-ups.

*design marking lines should not be visible.

*stitches on the back should be neat and even.

- *thread tension should be evenly balanced.
- *spacing of the quilting should be appropriate.

Binding:

*should be neatly and securely stitched.

*should be appropriate to the design of the quilt top.

*curved corners should flow smoothly without puckers.

*square corners should be 90 degrees.

*should be uniformly filled.

QUILTS USING INNOVATIVE TECHNIQUES:

Definition: Quilt (technically innovative) made with at least three layer of materials.

As quilting continues to expand with non-traditional applications, techniques and materials, it is important that innovative guilts and fibre art in general meet with the standards already established with traditional quilts. *a quilt must hang flat when intended as a wall quilt.

*an innovative guilt consists of three layers and has guilting visible on front and back.

*any loose threads and/or embellishments must be an integral part of the overall design.

*any innovative guilt presented on a rigid frame must have quilting visible on both sides.
