EMT SKILLS MANDATORY ACTIONS

Skill: Mandatory Actions:

Long Spine Board Checks PMS prior to and post all directed movements

Secures body to LSB before head

Maintains spinal immobilization throughout procedure

O2 Setup & Administration Cracks tank if device appropriate

Secures regulator to tank without leaks

Applies appropriate oxygen delivery device at proper flow rate

Traction Splint

Checks PMS prior to and post all directed movements

Measures splint to unaffected leg

Cardiac Arrest Management /

AED

Checks appropriate breathing and pulse for no longer than 10

seconds

Immediately begins high quality CPR when appropriate

Allows adequate chest rise and fall

Utilizes correct compression to ventilation ratios

Allows complete chest recoil

Provides adequate volumes with manual breath Minimizes interruption to 10 seconds or less Follows prompts and correctly attaches AED Holds compression for rhythm analysis

The last compression for my time unarysis

Clears patient for hazards prior to administering defibrillation

Joint Immobilization Checks PMS prior to and post all directed movements

Immobilizes patient joint appropriately / In POC

Bleeding Control / Shock

Management

Stops bleeding

Applies appropriate O2 therapy

Warms patient

Airway Management Appropriately measures airway adjunct

Discontinues insertion of OPA if gag reflex detected

EMT SKILLS MANDATORY ACTIONS (Cont.)

Skill: Mandatory Actions:

KED / Vest Extrication Checks PMS prior to and post all directed movements

Secures device to torso before head

Maintains spinal immobilization throughout procedure

Long Bone Immobilization Checks PMS prior to and post all directed movements

Immobilizes patient joint appropriately / In POC

Medication Administration Five Rights of Medication Administration (Patient, Medication,

Dose, Route, and Time)

Uses proper aseptic technique prior to administration

Considers appropriate contraindications for analgesic usage Reasseses patient post medication administration for intended

and untoward effects

Appropriately monitors patient vital signs post administration
