The Order of Augustinian Recollects now has 1200 priests and brothers working in 22 countries around the world: Argentina, Brazil, Chile, China, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, England, Guatemala, Indonesia, Islas Marianas, Italy, Mexico, Panama, Peru, Philippines, Sierra Leone, Spain, Taiwan, United States and Venezuela.



For the Augustinian Recollects, like the early Christians, the key word is community: they pray in community, live in community, work in community.

Their pastoral work is conditioned by the needs of the country they are in. And so, they run schools and universities, parishes and missions, centres of social integration and immigrants' chaplaincies.
