MECSU NOTES THE FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PROTECTOR ON SENIOR

UNQUALIFIED OFFICIALS RUNNING THE DITSOBOTLA LOCAL MUNICIPALITIES

AS THEY PLEASE

We, Municipal Employees & Civil Servants Union (MECSU), are deeply concerned about

the appointments of officials without qualifications in senior positions in the country's

municipalities. Public Protector findings about Ditsobotla Local Municipality's appointees

with or without matric in senior positions are a true reflection of a real situation across the

majority of the country's municipalities. The scandal in the Ditsobotla Local Municipality

is just a tip of an iceberg. We are failing to accept the reality of having municipalities which

appoint unqualified officials in senior positions while there are suitable candidates with

requisite qualifications. In some instances, these senior positions would be advertised for

compliance purposes, while in other instances, positions would be filled without

advertising. As MECSU, operating in local government space, we cannot fold hands and

look at unqualified incumbents occupy senior strategic positions while incumbents with

requisite qualifications are trapped in junior or subordinate positions taking orders from

unqualified senior officials, who merely get appointed by virtue of their proximity to certain

families, friends and relatives in positions of authority.

We send a stem warning to those unqualified officials holding senior positions in our

country's municipalities that they must either step down or face the music.

We also want to categorically send a clear message to those HR officials who disregard

HR Recruitment policies of municipalities and provide jobs to families, friends and

relatives that the time for job for pals is over. Those officials who get involved in

recruitment scandalous acts will be dealt with very harshly because they know better what

it means to flout HR Prescripts.
