



CODE OF CONDUCT AND SCHOOL RULES

Parents

Good behaviour and discipline are key foundations for good education. Without an orderly atmosphere effective teaching and learning cannot take place. We expect and insist on the highest standards of behaviour throughout our school.

Courtesy, good manners and consideration for others, together with self-discipline and a proper respect for authority, are encouraged at all times. These are important if we are to make our school a true, caring community. We place great emphasis on praising children for politeness and kindness to others.

The Principal will bring any serious breach of discipline or any disruptive behaviour to the attention of the parents concerned and an appropriate course of action will be decided upon.

Learners

All learners are expected to make a full committed all facets of the school and support the positive endeavors of all its members. Rules are essential for the benefit of all in any community and we try to keep these as simple as possible, but we do expect them to be kept.

General Principles

- 1. Learners are always expected to behave in a courteous and considerate manner towards each other, all members of staff and visitors to the school.
- 2. Learners are expected to abide by the school rules about appearance and behavior when representing the school both during School hours and after School hours, at School and away from School. Learners may not say or do anything that will discredit themselves or the school.
- 3. No learner has the right at any time to behave in a manner that will disrupt the learning activity of other learners or will cause another learner physical or emotional harm.
- 4. The school will contact parents/guardians when a learner's behavior becomes a cause of concern and will endeavour, in a spirit of constructive partnership, to resolve the problem.

REF to the UNIFORM POLICY

Learners are expected to wear the official School uniform and always appear neat and tidy.

1. No additions to the uniform that are not in accordance with the regulations will be allowed.

The official school uniform is a navy/red school collar T-shirt and a school hoodie. In winter a learner may wear a school beanie which has only the emblem on it.

- 2. Fingernails must be kept always trimmed short and clean.
- 3. During events that allow the wearing of casual wear, learners should wear neat, presentable clothes. Beachwear, tight-fitting clothes, clothes that are see-through and/or too revealing are not allowed. Hair, shoes and accessories should always be neat.

School and Classroom Attendance

Parents/guardians, learners, teachers and School Governing Body (SGB) members are jointly responsible for ensuring that all learners attend School.

- 1. If a learner does not attend School regularly, the relevant register teacher will report the absence of the learner to the administrator, who will send an email to the parent. The register teacher must keep an accurate register of learner attendance.
- 2. All learners are to arrive at School before the official starting time 07:00. Learners who are late for School will be marked absent as registers are completed at the beginning of each School Day.
- 3. Absence from a class, without the permission of the relevant register or subject teacher, is prohibited.
- 4. Any absence from School must be covered by an email/WhatsApp or letter from a parent/guardian before 08.00.
- 5. No learner may leave the School during School hours without an letter from a parent/guardian requesting the release of their child *and* the permission of the principal. School finishes at **13:30**
- 6. Truancy from School is prohibited.
- 7. Regular school attendance is compulsory for all learners. The position of a child as a learner at the school may come under review if the child has been absent for 10 or more days in a school term without a valid excuse or doctor's certificate. The principal reserves the right to refuse admittance at the start of the following school term to any learner who absconds in this manner.



Transport

- 1. All learners' transport must arrive and leave on time, if transport collects learners during school hours, a warning will be Issued.
- 2. The Code of Conduct is applicable when making use of public transport to and from School.
- 3. Learners may not hitchhike while in School uniform.

Valuables and personal belongings

The School will not be held responsible for theft of or damage to personal belongings on School premises (e.g. cell phones, bags, books, bicycles, bikes and clothing).

- 1. Learners should avoid bringing cell phones, large sums of money and valuables to School. Cell phones may not be switched on during a normal School Day.
- 2. Learners may not share computer games and may only play them if they have received permission from the educator. They may not bring iPods, flash drives, hard drives or similar electronic devices to School.
- 4. Cellphones are to be handed in to class educators.

General Rules

- 1. All litter must be placed in refuse bins or wastepaper baskets.
- 2. Willful damaging, vandalizing or neglect of School property and the property of others, either by writing or by a physical act, is prohibited. Theft of School and private property is also prohibited.
- 3. Any act of cheating in class work, homework, informal and formal tests or internal or external examination is prohibited. Furthermore, copying of and/or borrowing another learner's work is forbidden.
- 4. Disruptive, unruly, rude and/or offensive behavior will not be tolerated.
- 5. The learner will respect the beliefs, culture, dignity and rights of other learners, as well as their right to privacy and confidentiality.
- 6. Language that is seen as pejorative, discriminatory or racist is prohibited.
- 7. Any act that belittles, demeans or humiliates another learner's culture, race or religion is prohibited.
- 8. All learners have the right to an education free of interference, intimidation and/or physical abuse. The learner will respect the property and safety of other learners. Fighting or threatening other learners is forbidden.





- 9. The learner will respect those learners in positions of authority. A learner who is in a position of authority will conduct him/herself in a manner befitting someone in authority. S/he will respect the rights of other learners and will not abuse such authority bestowed upon him/her through his/her position.
- 10. The carrying, copying and/or reading of offensive material is prohibited.
- 11. Learners must keep clear of areas that are indicated as out of bounds. These include:
 - 11.1 The school staff's parking bays.
 - 11.2 Electrical mains distribution boxes, fire extinguishers and hoses.
 - 11.3 Classrooms and office (you may only enter with permission)
- 12. At break time learners must start moving back to the classroom to the sound of the bell.

Rules Governing Public Places

The school is a place of safety where laws pertaining to public spaces are applicable.

- 1. No dangerous objects or illegal drugs as defined in the SA Schools Act, or the Safety Regulations will be brought onto and/or used on the School property unless authorized by the Principal for educational purposes. Dangerous objects include knives, firearms or any item that could harm a person.
- 2. The carrying and/or smoking of cigarettes and electronic cigarettes (E-Vape) is prohibited.
- 3. Alcohol is not permitted on School premises or during any School activity.
- 4. The carrying of and/or consumption of illegal chemical substances and drugs is prohibited.





School Enrichment Programme

Involvement in activities making up the School Enrichment Programmed forms a valuable and integral part of the holistic education of every learner. All learners are, therefore, expected to become actively involved in the activities presented to them during the term.

- 1. The learner is expected to adopt the correct etiquette pertaining to the specific activity at all times.
- 2. Once a learner has committed him/herself to an activity, s/he will be bound to meet the rules and obligations related to that activity.
- 3. Involvement in a particular activity will span the entire season/duration in which that activity takes place.

Disciplinary System

Every teacher is responsible for discipline and has the full authority and responsibility to correct the behavior of learners whenever such correction is necessary. Any corrective measure or disciplinary action will correspond with and be appropriate to the offence. All learners will abide by the discipline system that has been developed to assist and guide learner behavior in the school.

Grading Offences

Offences are graded according to the nature and degree of seriousness of the offences, of which Grade 4 offences are the most serious. See Annexure B, Table 1 for a list of the offences making up each of the Grades 1, 2, 3 and 4. See Annexure B, Table 2 for a list of the possible disciplinary measures to be applied for Grade 1, 2, 3 and 4 offences respectively.

Disciplinary Procedures

The grade of an offence will determine the procedure to be followed.

- 1. Grade 1 offence three offences and a written warning followed by another written warning should the offences continue, then a disciplinary hearing.
- 2. Grade 2 offence a written warning followed by a disciplinary hearing, then a tribunal hearing.
- 3. Grade 3 offence a disciplinary hearing or a tribunal hearing (depending on the severity of the particular offence).
- 4. Grade 4 offence offence immediately reported to the South African Police Service (SAPS) and a tribunal hearing.





Grade 1: Offences

All Grade 1 offences will be dealt with by the staff member concerned who must keep a written record of such offences and the disciplinary measures taken. Should Grade 1 offences keep occurring, the matter will be referred to the Grade Head and the Grade Head will write to the parent/guardian. The letter will be kept on record by the Grade Head.

Should the Grade 1 offence/offences recur after disciplinary intervention has occurred and a written letter has been issued, the staff member will, in consultation with the Grade Head, arrange an interview with the learner, the Grade Head and the Principal. A written warning will be issued to the learner and the parent/guardian. A signed copy of the acknowledgement will be kept on record.

The Grade Head will keep on record copies of all relevant documentation relating to the offences and the disciplinary measures imposed.

Grade 2: Offences

All Grade 2 offences will immediately be referred to the Grade Head. The staff members will, in consultation with the Grade Head, arrange an interview with the learner and the principal. A written warning will be sent to the parent/guardian, and a signed copy will be kept on record.

When a second Grade 2 offence occurs after a written warning has been issued for the first offence, the Grade Head will refer the matter to the principal for a disciplinary hearing. The parent/guardian will be advised in writing, and their attendance will be expected.

Should Grade 2 offences continue, or when a learner is to receive their third warning, the principal may decide to take the learner to a tribunal hearing to consider the suspension or expulsion of the learner. The parent/guardian will be advised in writing, a minimum of five (5) days before the designated date that a tribunal hearing has been convened.

The Grade Head will keep on record copies of all relevant documentation relating to the offences.

Grade 3: Offences

All Grade 3 offences will immediately be reported to the Grade Head. The Grade Head will refer the matter to the Disciplinary Committee who will, depending on the severity of the offence, determine whether to convene a disciplinary hearing or a tribunal hearing. The parent/guardian will be advised in writing, a minimum of five (5) days before the designated date if a tribunal hearing has been convened.





Grade 4: Offences

All Grade 4 offences will immediately be reported to the Grade Head. The Grade Head will refer the matter to the School Principal who will immediately file a report with the SAPS and convene a tribunal hearing. The parent/guardian will be informed immediately of the offence and be advised in writing, a minimum of five (5) days before the designated date that a hearing has been convened.

Warning Letters

Warning letters must be signed by the learner and one of their parents and the principal. They must also state the Grade of the offence. A learner may not return to school until the signed warning letter has been returned to the school.

First warning: The Principal and teacher involved will meet with the learner.

Second warning: The parents will be called in to meet with the Principal, the teacher involved and the learner. This is a disciplinary meeting.

Third warning: A tribunal meeting may be called between the Grade Head, the Principal, a School Governing Body member, the learner and the learner's parent/guardian will be present.

Three warning letters will result in expulsion. However, depending on the severity of the offence, the learner may be expelled without the benefit of three warnings.

Explanation of Terms

The Grade Head is the educator responsible for the learner's grade.

A **Warning Letter** is the official communication to the parent after repeated Grade 1 offences or after a Grade 2 - 4 offence. It needs to state clearly the Grade of Offence involved and it must be signed by the parent and the learner. This signed copy will be kept on record by the school.

At a **Disciplinary hearing** the Grade Head or the staff member involved, the Principal and the learner will be present. If it is about the issuing of a second warning the parent will be involved.

At a **Tribunal hearing** the Grade Head, the Principal, a School Governing Body member, the learner and the learner's parent/guardian will be present.





Disciplinary Interventions

- 1. The following list of interventions and corrective measures used by the school are aimed at correcting behavior before suspension and expulsion:
- A verbal warning/reprimand to express disapproval.
- · Written warning.
- · Final written warning.
- · Removal from classes to the exclusion room.
- Referral for counselling.
- Fines to compensate for damages, to cover the cost of repair or replacement of the lost or damaged item, and/or the accumulated fine.
- Exclusion from School activities and functions, e.g. academic award ceremony.
- · Withdrawal of recognition, e.g. award.
- Temporary suspension from class or School, pending disciplinary hearing.
- · Disciplinary hearing.
- · Tribunal hearing.
- 2. Failure to comply with interventions and corrective measures will lead to further interventions and may lead to the offence being categorized at a higher grade. Expulsion may be recommended for a Grade 3 and a Grade 4 offence.

See Annexure B, Table 2 for a list of the possible disciplinary measures to be applied for Grade 1, 2, 3 and 4 offences respectively.

- 3. Conduct that may lead to suspension/exclusion includes, but is not limited to, the following:
- · Conduct that violates the rights or safety of others.
- · Criminal behaviour of any kind.
- Defacing or destroying School property.
- Disrespectful or objectionable conduct and verbal abuse directed at teachers, other School employees or fellow learners.
- Outright defiance of lawful requests or instructions issued by persons in authority.
- Indulging in harmful graffiti, racism or "hate speech".
- · Sexual harassment or sexual assault.





- · Immoral behavior or profanity.
- Possessing, using or displaying evidence of use of any narcotics, unauthorized drugs, alcohol or any other intoxicant.
- Repeated infringements of the school rules or the Code of Conduct.
- Possession of dangerous weapons (guns, knives and other objects which may threaten the lives of learners/teachers).
- 4. Should a learner be found guilty by a court of law for breaking the law of the Republic of South Africa, the School has the right, after a fair hearing through the Governing Body, to consider expulsion.
- 5. A tribunal hearing will be convened with a view to recommending expulsion.
- 6. Should the tribunal decide against expulsion, the learner will attend counselling or the relevant life skills program, at their or their parents own cost, before they may return to class
