****You must do the Bible Reading Square! You must read 1 book from the list & each square counts as 1 project****

<p style="text-align: center;">Literary Artifacts</p> <p>Gather 5 artifacts that represent your book. Each artifact must have a paragraph that explains its connection to the book. Your paragraph must also include a quote from the book with an explanation of why you feel this quote represents this artifact. (Be sure to cite each quote's page number.)</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">****BIBLE READING****</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Choose a topic and keep a log of Bible verses you read concerning that specific topic. You may do multiple topics, but you must have at least 25 scriptures.</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Write 1 paragraph (minimum 8 sentences) on what your chosen topic means to you and/or how it applies to your life.</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Some topic examples: Faith, love, self-control, grace, forgiveness, humility, discipline, modesty, purity, kindness, perseverance (any that stand out to you)</i></p>	<p style="text-align: center;">CHARACTER TRADING CARD</p> <p>Choose 2 characters from the novel you read and create a CHARACTER TRADING CARD for each one.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Character Descriptions</p> <p>Choose 2 characters from your book and create a T-Chart. Write 5 adjectives to describe each character and show the evidence from the text to support the adjectives you've used to describe these characters.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>*These 2 assignments count as 1</i></p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Book Cover Redesign (Fiction or Nonfiction)</p> <p>Project Description: Create a new cover for this book that you think best represents one or more of the major themes of the text and write a paragraph of analysis, explaining how the image connects to the book's themes.</p> <p>Project Checklist: Create original book cover illustration (8.5x11 or bigger) Write an analysis paragraph (at least 200 words, should include at least 2 quotes from the text) An analysis is where you break down, explain, or examine the text.</p> <p>Do you want to change something about your book? Add one paragraph on what you would like to have changed... possibly a new ending? Adding in a new character?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Movie Poster Project (Fiction or Nonfiction)</p> <p>Project Description: You've been hired to create a MOVIE POSTER for the novel you read. Design your poster to get your audience to want to read the book. Consider the characters and their likeness, the tone and mood of the novel, and the theme. Use images from the internet, your own drawings, or a combination of the two.</p> <p>Project Checklist: A new cast of actors (living or dead from any time) A proper rating of the novel A credit place with the director, writer, and cast Attached to the poster, add one paragraph explaining your poster & design. Tell me how each part leads to a deeper understanding of the novel.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">LETTER WRITING</p> <p>Write a 1-2 page letter to your teacher and tell him/her about the novel you read! Make sure you tell him/her the main characters, problem, solution, and if you enjoyed and/or would recommend the book and why!</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Create a Crossword Puzzle or create a test</p> <p>Create a crossword puzzle with at least 10-15 clues about your book. Must have crossword puzzle & solution. OR Create a test with 10 questions and include an answer key.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>*These 2 assignments count as 1 project*</i></p>
