MEETING RECAP

Guest artist and oil painter Julia Munger Seelos, did a wonderful demo for us in April. She usually paints on sight, but for our demo she painted from a lovely image that she had taken along the way. Since Julia is most used to doing Plein Air, Alla Prima painting, it was amazing to see how quickly her painting came together. She uses a limited palette with what she called a few cheat colors, including Gray Violet (by Daler Rowney & used in the road of her painting), Naples Yellow Pale (great for golden grasses) and Diochromatic Black (by Gamlin, has more life that other blacks). Because her subjects are mostly landscapes with lots of blues and greens, Julia first stains her



canvas with orange, then uses her brush to do a quick drawing. She then lays in her darkest shapes continuing with dark to light colors and thin to thick layers of paint, saving the blue sky till the end, so as to help shape the trees. Lastly she pays attention to softening the background shapes keeping the sharp edges around the focal point. Julia's favorite brand of oil paints is Utrecht, which she says is most affordable for artist quality.
