
BURLINGAME ART SOCIETY

Recap

In February, John Warner returned to BAS to give us another delightful watercolor demo. John began his art career as a commercial artist, but found that it did not give him pleasure, so he went back to school to get his teaching degree. An accomplished painter in acrylic and oil, John eventually switched to watercolor.

John loves the coast, and spent ten years painting the ocean. He said that watercolors and water go together well, because water is reflective. He especially likes to paint in Hawaii, where he says that the water is "incredible." Also, John prefers to paint wild scenes rather than architecture.

John began his demo by drawing a quick sketch onto a stretched piece of Arches 140 cold press paper that he had previously soaked in a bathtub for 2 minutes. He then taped the paper to a drawing board with a moistened strip of gummed tape, and allowed it to dry for 2-3 hours.

John often works from a photograph, and said, "Don't be a slave to a photograph. Eliminate things you don't want in your painting." John uses blue painter's tape instead of frisket, because he finds that frisket leaves a yellow stain. In John's demo, he used several small, torn pieces of tape in the area where he was planning to paint his trees. "Always leave places in the trees for the birds to fly through," John pronounced with a smile.

When painting the sky, John said that he only adds clouds if there is a lot of sky, and he cautioned us not to spend too much time painting the sky. He said that going over and over the sky not only kills the sky, but also kills the paper.

John frequently uses people to add a little human interest in his paintings; often just as silhouettes in the distance. "If you're not going to do birds, at least do people."

Thank you John, we enjoyed watching you paint, and learning about your tips and techniques.
