

MENTOR TEXT – BOOKLET 25

On Saturday 31st May 2025, at approximately 9:30 a.m., a vendor was arrested at the Tunapuna Market by two police officers for selling what appeared to be an illegal substance. This report details what I witnessed during the incident.
