My father, who was outside in the yard talking to a neighbour, came inside instantly. He related that the entire street was also in darkness, while picking Mikey off the floor, since he was now crying.

At the same time, my mother searched the bottom drawer in the kitchen to find the candles and matches. She always kept them there for emergencies like this. I was able to assist by remembering where the flashlights were. We kept two flashlights in the hallway closet. I got the flashlights and gave one to my mother and kept one for myself.

Shortly after, my mother lit two candles, placing one on the living room table and the other on the kitchen counter. My father went to check the circuit breaker box and turned off a few breakers.

Since there wasn't much to do in the dark, my father suggested that we sit in the gallery for a moment. While there, my father went to the front yard and continued chatting with a few neighbours who were now gathered in the street. He then told us that he could see two TnTEC trucks down the street and the workers seemed to be fixing something on a pole. My mother, Mikey and I remained sitting in the gallery as I played games on my phone.

After about an hour, just as I was getting a bit bored, the lights flickered on. There was a loud cheer heard around the community. My mother instantly got up and went inside as she blew out the candles. The television also turned back on but not the air condition.

Although later than expected, I was able to finish my homework before going to bed.

Report on Witnessing a Dog Bite at the Park

On April 14, 2025 at approximately 4:30 p.m. I witnessed a dog biting incident at the community park, located on Maple Street, Sunshine Gardens, Arouca. The following report details what took place during and immediately after this unexpected incident.
