

## REPORT #1

### AN INCIDENT IN THE SCHOOL CORRIDOR

On Tuesday 21st June, 2026 at approximately 10:35 a.m., an accident occurred in the corridor outside the school library, involving Kevin Boodram and Shaun Alexander, both of standard four. This report gives details about what I, Aaliyah Ramnarine, witnessed as the situation unfolded.

During morning break, two students, Kevin Boodram and Shaun Alexander, were running along the corridor near the library. They appeared to be racing each other towards the staircase. As Kevin reached the area beside the library's entrance, he slipped on the tiled floor. While trying to keep his balance, he fell against a wooden shelf that was positioned near the doorway. The shelf toppled over, causing a large number of library books to fall onto the floor.

Several students who were nearby moved out of the way when the shelf fell. No student was struck by the shelf or the books. Kevin sustained a small scrape on his right elbow from the fall. Shaun was not injured.

Mrs. Charles, the teacher on corridor duty, arrived at the scene within one minute. She checked on Kevin's condition and then escorted him to the school nurse for treatment. Mrs. Charles instructed other students to stand back from the area for safety reasons.

The librarian, Mr. Phillip, was called to assess the damage. Approximately thirty books were knocked from the shelf. Four books had bent covers and two books had torn pages. The shelf itself was not damaged and was returned to its upright position by Mr. Phillip and Mrs. Charles.

As a result of the incident, Kevin and Shaun were asked to report to the Vice Principal's office. Both students were reminded of the school rule that prohibits running in the corridors. The library remained closed for fifteen minutes while the books were collected and the area was cleared. This report has been submitted to provide an accurate account of the events witnessed.



## REPORT #2

### A VISIT TO THE FIRE STATION

On Thursday 16th July, 2026 from approximately 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., my class visited the Arima Fire Station as part of our "Community Helpers" project. This report gives details about what I, Sarah Smith, observed and learnt during the visit.

Our class, along with our teacher Mrs. Charles, arrived at the fire station by bus. We were met by Fire Officer Mr. Daniel Roberts, who welcomed the class and introduced himself as the officer in charge of the station. He was accompanied by two other firefighters, Ms. Kerry Solomon and Mr. Anthony Duke, who assisted with the tour.

The class was first shown the garage area where the fire trucks were parked. Mr. Roberts explained the different parts of a fire truck, including the water tank, the hose reel and the ladder attachment. He also explained how the trucks are checked and prepared before each shift.

Next, the class visited the equipment room. Ms. Solomon showed the students the protective clothing worn by firefighters, including the helmet, jacket, boots and breathing apparatus. She explained the purpose of each item and how it protects firefighters during emergencies.

The class then visited the control room, where Mr. Duke explained how emergency calls are received and how the station communicates with other fire stations across the country.

Following this, the students were taken outside for a demonstration of how a fire hose is connected and operated. Two students were selected to assist with holding the hose under supervision.

Before leaving, the class learnt about basic fire safety measures, including the importance of smoke detectors and having a fire escape plan both at home and at school. The visit ended at approximately 1:00 p.m. when the class departed and returned to school by bus. This report has been submitted to provide a detailed accurate account of the visit.

## REPORT #3

### THE SCHOOL ASSEMBLY

On Monday 20th March, 2026 at approximately 8:30 a.m., a special school assembly was held in the main hall of the school to honour specific students for various commendable reasons. I, Aaliyah Busy, received an award during this assembly and this report recalls the occasion as it occurred.

The assembly began with the school choir singing the National Anthem, followed by the school prayer, which was led by a standard five student, Celine Dion. The principal, Mrs. Alicia Fernandez, then addressed the school and welcomed all students, teachers and visiting parents to the event.
