

REPORT #1

INCIDENT DURING A SCIENCE EXPERIMENT

On Wednesday 22nd September, 2026 at approximately 1:15 p.m. an accident occurred in the Standard Four classroom during a science lesson. This report gives details about what I, Jamal Thomas, witnessed as the situation unfolded.

During the science lesson, students were placed in groups to conduct an experiment involving the mixing of coloured water solutions. My group, which included Devon Singh, Priya Maharaj and Kyle Antoine, was seated at the back table near the window.

While Devon was moving a container of blue coloured water from one side of the table to the other, his elbow accidentally knocked against the container held by Priya. The container tipped over and a large amount of the coloured water spilled onto the floor. The liquid spread quickly across the tiles beneath the table and along part of the walkway between the desks.

Kyle immediately alerted our teacher, Mr. Anthony Baptiste, who was assisting another group at the time. Mr. Baptiste instructed all students to move away from the wet area to avoid slipping. He then retrieved paper towels and a mop from the supply cupboard to begin cleaning the spill.

No student was injured during the incident. However, the coloured water left a visible stain on the classroom floor that could not be fully removed despite cleaning efforts. Devon's exercise book, which had been placed near the container, was also stained and several pages were damaged.

As a result of the incident, Mr. Baptiste reminded the class about the importance of handling laboratory materials with care. The group was asked to assist with cleaning the area before the lesson continued. The matter was reported to the school's maintenance staff for further cleaning of the stained floor.
