

REPORT #1

INCIDENT DURING P.E. CLASS

On Tuesday 21st July, 2026 at approximately 2:00 p.m. an accident occurred on the school field during a Physical Education class. This report gives details about what I, Aaliyah Ramnarine, witnessed as the situation unfolded.

During the P.E. period, students were divided into teams to play a game of football under the supervision of Mr. Anthony Baptiste. The game was taking place on the field located beside the Standard Three classroom block.

While the game was in progress, Kyle Antoine attempted to kick the ball towards the goal. The ball missed the goal and travelled instead towards the classroom block. It struck one of the windows of the Standard Three classroom, causing the glass to crack.

No student was near the window at the time and no one was injured as a result of the incident. Mr. Baptiste immediately stopped the game and instructed the students to move away from the area near the classroom block for safety reasons.

Mr. Baptiste then examined the window and confirmed that the glass had cracked but had not shattered completely. He reported the matter to the school office and requested that the area beneath the window be cordoned off until the glass could be repaired.

As a result of the incident, the football game was ended earlier than scheduled. Kyle was asked to explain what had happened to the Vice Principal, Mr. Samuel Grant. The class was reminded about the importance of being mindful of the direction of play during games held near the classroom buildings. The school's maintenance staff was informed of the damage so that arrangements could be made for the window to be repaired.



REPORT #2

INCIDENT AT A NEIGHBOUR'S HOUSE

On Sunday 19th July, 2026 at approximately 5:45 p.m. an incident occurred at the home of our neighbour, Mrs. Josephine Alexander. This report gives details about what I, Jude Walker, witnessed and the actions I took.

While playing in the yard with my brother, I noticed grey smoke coming from the kitchen window of Mrs. Alexander's house next door. At first, the amount of smoke was small, but it appeared to be increasing steadily as I continued to watch.

I immediately called my brother's attention to what I had seen. I then went inside our house to inform you, since you were in the living room at the time. You came outside to observe the smoke and confirmed that it was coming from the kitchen area of the house.

You instructed me to remain in our yard while you went to check on Mrs. Alexander. You knocked on her front door and called out to alert her of the smoke. Mrs. Alexander came to the door and explained that a pot had been left unattended on the stove.

Mrs. Alexander returned to the kitchen and removed the pot from the stove. She opened the kitchen windows to allow the smoke to clear from the house. You remained outside her house for a few minutes to make sure the situation was under control.

After the smoke had cleared, Mrs. Alexander came outside and thanked you for alerting her. She explained that she had stepped away from the kitchen to answer a phone call and had lost track of time. No damage was caused to the house and no injuries occurred as a result of the incident.



REPORT #3

THE NATIONAL CULTURAL SHOWCASE

On Wednesday 15th July, 2026 at approximately 6:00 p.m. a national cultural showcase was held at the National Academy for the Performing Arts, located in Port of Spain. This report gives details about what I, Aaliyah Ramnarine, observed during the function.

The showcase was organised to allow schools from across the country to display their talents in music, dance and drama. Our school choir, consisting of twenty students, was selected to represent our school at the event. I was one of the students who performed as part of the choir.

The function began with opening remarks from the Minister of Education, who welcomed all the schools and guests in attendance. Following this, the programme proceeded with performances from the various schools, presented in the order listed in the printed programme.
