

## **REPORT #1**

### **A DOG BITE INCIDENT AT THE COMMUNITY PARK**

On Saturday 18th July, 2026 at approximately 4:30 p.m., an unexpected incident occurred at the Malabar Community Park, near the children's play area beside the walking track. This report gives details about what I, Keith James, witnessed as the situation unfolded.

I was seated on a bench near the play area with my mother when I noticed a small brown dog walking near a group of people close to the entrance of the park. The dog did not appear to be on a leash and was walking freely among the visitors.

A man who was jogging along the track approached the area where the dog was standing. As he passed by, the dog suddenly ran towards him and bit his lower leg. The man stumbled backward and called out in pain. The owner of the dog, a woman standing nearby, immediately ran over and pulled the dog away by its collar.

Several people in the park, including my mother, moved closer to assist the injured man. My mother offered a clean cloth from her bag, which was used to apply pressure to the wound to control the bleeding. Another park visitor called for emergency assistance using a mobile phone.

The dog's owner apologised repeatedly and provided her contact information to the injured man. She explained that the dog had slipped out of its leash earlier and that she had been attempting to retrieve it.

Park security arrived shortly afterward and asked the dog owner to leave the park with the animal. An ambulance arrived approximately fifteen minutes later, and the injured man was taken for medical treatment.



## REPORT #2

### MESSAGES SEEN ON A CLASSROOM COMPUTER

I considered the situation and decided that it was necessary to inform a teacher, since the messages appeared to be unkind and could affect Marcus if he became aware of them. I approached Mrs. Elizabeth Charles later that day during class time and informed her of what I had seen.

Mrs. Charles thanked me for reporting the matter and stated that she would look into the situation further. She also reminded me that it was appropriate to bring such matters to a teacher's attention.



## REPORT #3

### THE SPORTS DAY AWARDS FUNCTION
