AN INCIDENT WITNESSED AT THE SUPERMARKET

On Saturday 18th May, 2026 at approximately 3:00 p.m., I witnessed a shoplifting at Massy Stores in San Juan, while shopping with my mother. This report gives details about what I, Adam Singh, witnessed on that occasion.

While walking through the aisle containing packaged snacks, I noticed a woman standing near the shelves ahead of my mother and me. She was holding a shopping basket in one hand and a small item, which appeared to be a bar of chocolate, in the other.

I observed the woman look around the aisle before placing the packet of biscuits into a large bag she was carrying, rather than into her shopping basket. She then continued walking down the aisle and did not place any other items into the bag while I could still see her.

I informed my mother of what I had seen. My mother then approached a nearby store employee and reported the matter, describing the woman's appearance and the direction in which she had walked.

The store employee thanked my mother for the information and contacted the store's security personnel using a handheld radio. My mother and I continued with our shopping and did not see what happened afterward, as we moved to a different section of the store.

Before leaving the supermarket, my mother spoke briefly with a customer service representative at the front desk to confirm that the matter had been passed on to security. The representative confirmed that security had been made aware of the situation and thanked my mother again for reporting it.



REPORT #2

COLLISION WITNESSED AT AN INTERSECTION

On Monday 20th February, 2026 at approximately 3:15 p.m. a collision occurred at the intersection of Eastern Main Road and Bamboo Settlement, St. Joseph. This report gives details about what I, Aaliyah Ramnarine, witnessed while walking home from school.

I was walking along the sidewalk near the intersection with two of my classmates when I noticed a silver car approaching from the direction of Bamboo Settlement Road. At the same time, a man riding a bicycle was crossing the intersection from the opposite direction.

As the car reached the intersection, it did not appear to slow down before proceeding through the junction. The bicycle, which was already crossing at the time, was struck on its rear wheel by the front of the car. The cyclist was thrown from the bicycle and landed on the road surface a short distance away.

The car came to a stop shortly after the collision. The driver, a man, got out of the vehicle and went to check on the cyclist. Several other pedestrians nearby also stopped to assist. One bystander used a mobile phone to call for emergency assistance.

The cyclist was conscious and able to speak, though he appeared to have injuries to his arm and leg. He remained seated on the road while waiting for help to arrive. The driver of the car remained at the scene and spoke with the cyclist and the bystanders while waiting for the police and ambulance to arrive.

An ambulance arrived approximately ten minutes later, and paramedics attended to the cyclist before transporting him for medical treatment. The car remained at the scene, and traffic in the area was temporarily redirected by bystanders until police arrived.

INCIDENT DURING THE SCHOOL MENTAL MATH COMPETITION

On Wednesday 22nd January, 2026 at approximately 10:00 a.m., I witnessed a fellow student cheating during the school's Mental Math Competition, held in the library. This report gives details about what I, Aaliyah Ramnarine, witnessed on that occasion.

I was present as a class representative supporting the competition, seated among a small group of students at the side of the room. Contestants were arranged at individual desks facing the front, where questions were read aloud by the competition coordinator, Mr. Gerald Thomas.

During one of the rounds, I noticed a contestant, a girl named Kimberly Ramnarine, lower her hand beneath her desk while a question was being read. On closer observation, I saw that she was holding a mobile phone and appeared to be entering numbers into a calculator application before writing her answer on the response sheet provided.

I did not say anything at the time, as the round was still in progress and I did not want to disrupt the other contestants. I made a note of what I had seen and waited for a suitable opportunity to report the matter.

During the break between rounds, I approached the competition judge, Mrs. Fay Alexander, and informed her of what I had witnessed. Mrs. Alexander thanked me for the information and stated that she would review the matter before the next round began.

When the competition resumed, an announcement was made reminding all contestants that the use of phones or calculators was strictly prohibited during the competition. I did not witness what further action, if any, was taken regarding Kimberly's participation or scoring.
