HOUSING

Persons seeking housing should check classified ads and rental signs. The renter should write out a budget to make sure he/she can afford rent, deposit, utilities, and other expenses. Once the person inspects the property, he/she should read the lease before signing it. A lease is a legal contract that offers protections to both renter and landlord. Subsidized housing for seniors, disabled and low-income persons usually have walting lists. Subsidized housing allows the renter to pay rent based on the household income, usually about 30% of gross income.
