For their service in East Texas, 20 African-American women who are community leaders, philanthropists and role models were recognized Tuesday by the Texas African-American Museum in Tyler.

The ceremony at the Tyler Rose Garden Center honored women who have worked hard in their careers and help their communities.

The women were: Reverend Orenthia Mason, Gayle Hayward, LaToyia Sessions-Jordan, Doris Batson, Veretta Rider, Kayla Lyons, Glinda Howard, JoAnn Hampton, Janae Holland, Debbie Broughton, Lisa Williams, Dorinda Williams, Suzette Farr, Yolanda Prince, Dr. Jennifer Jackson, Dr. Angela Smith, Dr. Cheryl Garmon, Dr. Shirley McKellar, Chanel Howard-Veazy and VaLita Waits.

Gloria Washington, TAAM executive director, encouraged attendees to support others and be an example for young girls.

"Your potential is great and it shows in your ever-being. Let's continue to teach our young females the importance of standing up for that which is right," Washington said. "We're here today to recognize for your strong endearment, your strong courage, your commitment to stay vigil and prepared for that which you are faced with. Strong women, strong faith. Strong leadership is much to be admired and saluted."

TAAM Volunteer Coordinator Denise Pendleton said the women's portraits will be on display at the museum for the rest of Black History Month and during March, which is Women's History Month. The museum is at 3000 N. Border Ave. in Tyler.

The biographies of the women will also be bound into a collection, Pendleton said.

"These are women not only accomplished in their chosen careers, but they are dedicated to a life of service," she said. "These are women who are moving our city forward."

Pendleton said they hope to make the recognition an annual event around February and March for Black History and Women's History months.

Wood County Precinct 2 Justice of the Peace Janae Holland encouraged women to be active and work to pursue their goals.

"We're got to go and we've got to set the example for these little girls. And for my son, who's sitting out there, who's 16, he's got to know that there's a strong woman behind him," Holland said. "So we've got to move."

American Heart Association Corporate Market Director Suzette Farr said she was humbled to be honored with the award and advocate for heart disease prevention.

"It means so much to me to be able to get out and advocate, educate and truly engage women and men of color in knowing more about the number one killer of our people, which is heart disease," Farr said.




