To install the trail properly would require to cut into the root system that the tree needs to keep in place and remain healthy. The roots must be removed to create a safe and ADA approved trail. The roots that need to be removed are quite large and will definitely put the tree in danger of blowing over in a high wind. The large roots are also a reason for the tree's survival. As you will notice in the pictures, the damage the roots have caused to the existing trail makes it very dangerous right now to even walk by.
