In the meantime, please join us on our recent journey through this wonderful site.

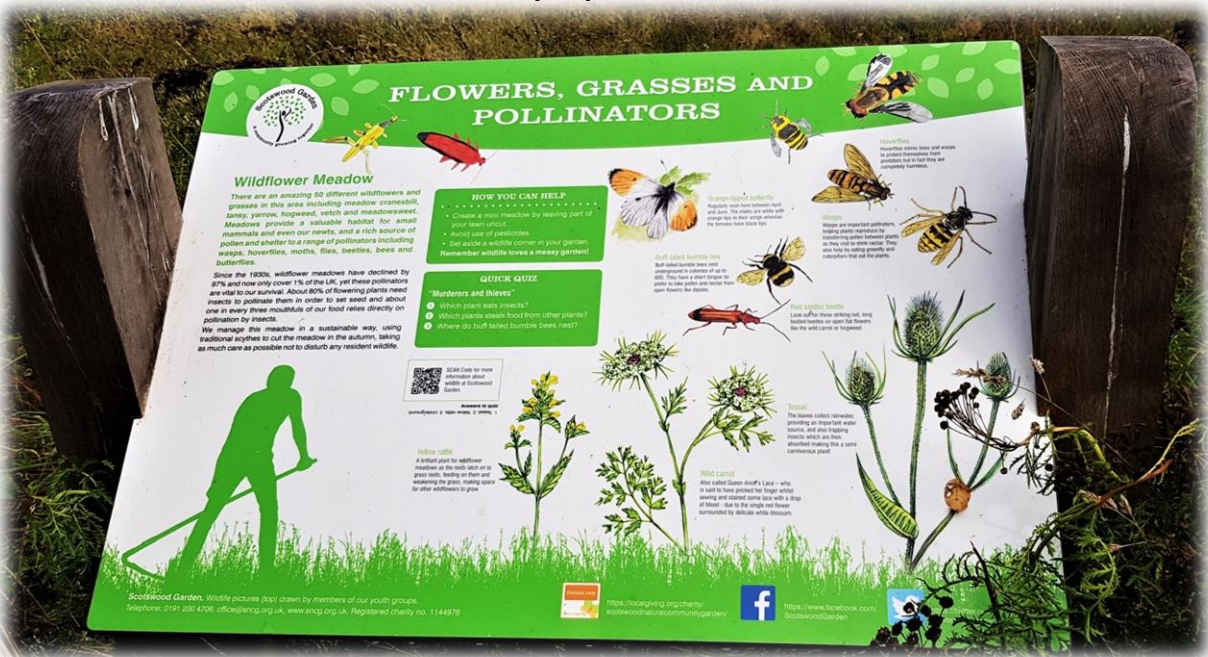

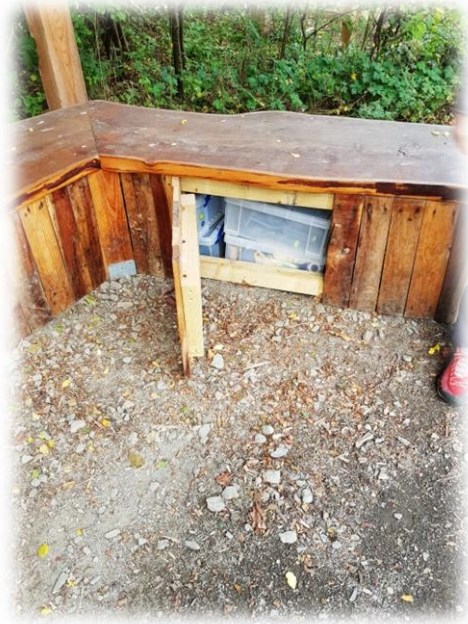
