

Humanness Is Innately Sovereign, Not Hierarchical

Mainstream media, politics, religions, dogmas, and profit-driven, greedy hollow corporations function as collective anesthetics, a circus of distraction designed to numb awareness, fracture attention, and keep the nervous system of the collective locked in fear, urgency, stress, comparison, and dependency.

Shame, guilt, fear, and unworthiness are weaponized. Codependency is normalized. Labor becomes a source of parasitic extraction of life-force rather than an expression of an authentic individual purpose. Time, debt, and scarcity are engineered to keep the collective exhausted, distracted, compliant, docile, and complacent.

While the collective survives from paycheck to paycheck, a hollow few accumulate, hoard, and control resources from a profoundly deep-rooted, fragile, curated, and fragmented insecurity, emptiness, and disconnection from their own humanness.
