

The Engineered Illusions of Hierarchical Control in Narcissistic Ego-driven Spiritually Impoverished Societies

A narcissistic, self-victimized, spiritually impoverished, hierarchical societal system sustains false authority and false hierarchy through individual and collective active or passive participation, attention, agreement, consent, and the belief that someone outside oneself has any type of authority over one's body, mind, and spirit.

In this hollow, corrupt, hierarchical status quo, self-victimization is weaponized to gain leverage, to create and enforce controlling, exploitative, and dominating frameworks, laws, norms, and policies. It indoctrinates false, curated ideologies, dogmas, and cultural paradigms, casting illusions on individuals where a middleman, an intermediary figure, a deity, or a system is perceived and believed to be above others, deserving more respect.

This curates fragmented identities, conditioning stories, and self-serving agendas meant to perpetuate false authority figures' power, wealth, and status, controlling political, economic, financial, educational, institutional, and corporate systems. It engineers scarcity, conflict, division, and fear, benefiting and profiting at the cost of others' well-being, while hiding behind hypocritical, moral, delusional, petty, and greedy hollow righteous facades.

It shapes the societal landscape with rehearsed divisive scenarios, distorted narratives, and dysfunctional propaganda that influence perception, conditioning individuals to be obedient, compliant, subservient, and submissive, fearing false external hierarchical systems and authority figures, along with their loyal "minions," who enforce, coerce, and punish anyone who does not self-abandon or self-betray to belong and be accepted by the oligarchical, corrupt, soulless, deceptive system.

Those who do not bend or compromise their sovereign, authentic truth, self-sufficiency, self-awareness, self-discernment, and inner authority are labeled and categorized, pressured to fit into parasitic societal scripts of order, security, freedom, sovereignty, identity, and justice. Meanwhile, self-victimization, self-sacrifice, survival-mode attachments, and forgetfulness are rewarded, while authentic sovereign self-expression, independence, and inner knowing are censored, suppressed, and punished.

The ones at the top of this Ponzi-like hierarchical system allure and tempt others to self-betray and self-abandon for money, possessions, status, power, and fame.

The illusion of order is presented as the foundation of societal stability, necessary to sustain control and authority over others. But beneath it lies a rigid, self-serving framework engineered to suppress individuality and regulate behavior. You are taught that without imposed order, chaos would consume everything, so you comply, you follow, you obey. You

become codependent and subservient to external “experts,” gurus, and authority figures with ranks, badges, or garments that induce fear and demand submission.

In truth, this “order” is not grounded in harmony but in fear-based control. It creates a controlled environment where spontaneity, authenticity, integrity, truth, and sovereign expression are seen as threats. Individuals police each other to ensure conformity, clinging to unresolved fears, pain, and trauma to avoid honest self-reflection and accountability. Order becomes the justification for obedience, codependency, and subservience, a silent agreement to remain within boundaries that were never yours.

Security is sold as protection, safety, and peace of mind, yet it is engineered through fear, scarcity, and dependency, stripping individuals of self-sufficiency and accountability. You are conditioned to believe you are unsafe alone, that you need systems and institutions to survive. You trade inner freedom for the illusion of external protection, while “security” becomes surveillance, restriction, and control, a loop where fear is created, then sold back as a solution.

Identity is packaged, labeled, and assigned through nationality, profession, status, and belief systems. You are taught to define yourself through external categories to feel like someone. Yet these are fragmented, curated identities, not your essence. They are roles, masks, and inherited stories. The more attached you become, the easier you are to control, because a labeled mind is a predictable mind.

Comparison is normalized as motivation and progress, but beneath it lies division and inadequacy. You are constantly measured against others, conditioned to feel “less than” or “more than,” chasing validation and external worth. It disconnects you from your own path, turning life into competition rather than authentic expression, making you forget that your value was never relative.

Science, in its pure form, is exploration and understanding. Yet within this system, it can be weaponized as unquestionable authority. Selective narratives are presented as absolute truth, and questioning is labeled as ignorance or rebellion. It shifts from discovery to control of perception. When knowledge is gatekept and institutionalized, it serves power rather than truth. True knowing invites curiosity; controlled knowledge demands compliance.

Justice is portrayed as fairness and balance, but within corrupt systems, it becomes selective enforcement. Rules vary by status and power. Punishment controls the many while protecting the few. What is called justice becomes legalized oppression, a performance of fairness masking imbalance, conditioning trust in systems that do not serve while discouraging self-discernment.

Each of these illusions survives through belief reinforced by participation.

The moment you begin to see clearly from within, not reactively, but consciously, you withdraw your agreement. What is not fed by attention, belief, and consent cannot sustain its illusion of power.
