

The Transactional Societal Theatre of Fear - Beyond Hive Mind Collective Agreements

Fake masks recognize fake masks. Unhealed wounds recognize unhealed wounds. Trauma seeks familiarity, convenience, and comfort before it seeks inner alchemical transformation, creating unconscious pain-based identity bonds where people preserve one another's pain

because shared suffering feels safer than shared freedom cultivated by sovereign, authentic, independent beings.

Comparison replaces curiosity. Competition replaces genuine collaboration. Possession replaces presence. Control replaces trust. Projection replaces self-understanding.

Whenever authentic creativity is traded solely for survival, life-force is gradually invested in maintaining corrupt, parasitic structures that never reflected the deepest flourishing of the human spirit.
