

CROSSREACH

CROSSREACH REPORT TO THE CONGREGATION 2023

On behalf of the Church of Scotland, CrossReach provides social care services in Christ's name, to people in challenging circumstances. But it remains the case that the name and the work of CrossReach are still largely unrecognised and unappreciated, both inside the Church and throughout the country. And that is regrettable because that which is unknown is liable to be under supported. The Church's practical work for social good, including counselling, treatment for dementia, and care of frail and vulnerable people deserves recognition.

CrossReach supports people who have a variety of needs, including problems of mental health, old age, homelessness, addictions, criminal justice, and exclusion. Domestic violence, drug dependency, and other fields of social need are often neglected or underfunded by public authorities, who welcome the role played by CrossReach.

The Church, and we, should voice our pride in CrossReach and its mission. In the midst of the challenges and changes facing the Church of Scotland we should be explicitly proud and grateful for having a Christian asset which works powerfully in the world.

Dunnichen, Letham & Kirkden Church supports CrossReach in different ways. Financially, through our Wilson & Peter Bequest, we give a lump sum of either £400 or £600 in alternate years to support the Bluebell Perinatal Service in Glasgow. We have also donated the offerings from our Christmas Services in recent years, and currently a proportion of the tea and coffee donations after the service goes to CrossReach – three months' worth this year amounting to £154. We know also that individual members commit to monthly giving to the organisation, while others take the opportunity to support the work of Cross-Reach by buying cards and other merchandise. We particularly commend the new CrossReach e-card service this year. Sending Christmas cards in this way helps us reduce our carbon impact while helping provide services for others at the same time. Full details of how to do this were outlined in the November "In the PICTure". Plus of course there are many others who pray for the staff and services of CrossReach and there is nothing better than that.

Please do what YOU can to offer support to CrossReach and the people it supports.

"Thank you" to everyone who once again responded so generously to the annual envelope appeal.

This year the total raised was £897.55 As we are able to claim additional income through the "Gift Aid" scheme, this should bring in a further £112 (approximately), making a final total of around £1,009.55.

This incredible total was assisted by two extremely generous donations from individuals plus the usual kind contribution from Letham Pensioners.

Only a few pounds less than our all time highest total, these donations are remarkable given the challenging circumstances many of us still find ourselves in.

This money contributes to the ongoing printing costs of the magazine which are now just short of £260 per month – quite an increase on previous years. However this Appeal total when added to the income from the local businesses that support us through their advertising, means we are able to maintain the magazine in a financially sound position – if only just.

DUNNICHEN, LETHAM & KIRKDEN TO JOIN WITH FOUR OTHER LOCAL CHURCHES

Further to previous articles in "In the PICTure" this update provides details of the progress being made to bring about the Union of the congregations of Aberlemno, Guthrie & Rescobie; Dunnichen, Letham & Kirkden; Forfar: Lowson Memorial; and Forfar: St Margaret's.

As a reminder, at the 2021 General Assembly, plans were agreed to address the significant challenges facing the Church of Scotland with the aim of establishing a leaner and fitter Church with a focus on mission. This was reflected in the Presbytery Mission Plan for Angus Presbytery, which determined amongst other things that this Union of five congregations should be taken forward.

Representatives of the five Kirk Sessions have been meeting for a number of months, and have now drafted the documents required to establish the Union. These will be voted on by the Kirk Sessions in early January next year, with congregational votes taking place later the same month. Elders are currently delivering an explanatory leaflet to all members of DLK Church, outlining the process and timescale and providing the necessary information to allow an informed vote. If all goes to plan, the Union should take effect from April 2024.




