Magnitude is a five day annual ecumenical Christian festival for young people aged 11-18. It is a space to encounter God, enjoy community and experience nature together.

Organised by Scripture Union, its aim is "to see a generation of young people captivated by the magnitude of who God is and transformed by encountering Him; a movement of young people, thousands strong, who go on to transform their churches, transform their communities, transform their nations and transform the world." Inspired by the Very Rev Dr Martin Fair who preached in Letham Church during February and March this year, many of our members donated generously. This allowed young people who could not afford the costs, to be able to attend this event.

WORLD MISSION REPORT



What do Haiti, the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), Ecuador, Papua New Guinea and Uganda have in common?

All of them have, to a greater or lesser extent, inner conflicts and civil war. They are not places to spend your holidays. But they are all countries where our mission partners MAF (Mission Aviation Fellowship) does its life-saving, Christian missionary work. Practical Christianity; bringing food aid, education and access to health to places of the world inaccessible except by airplane.

I have reported in the past about two MAF missionaries who were held captive in Mozambique – now mercifully relieved. Letham's MAF missionary partners Ruth and Duncan Jack from Glasgow serve in Uganda where Ruth is Country Director for Uganda. The organisation "Transparency International" describes Uganda as "one of the most corrupt countries in the world" which also has an appalling human rights record, uses child labour, uses child slavery and criminalises LGBT people. Despite being nominally 85% Christian, clearly MAF has work to do exemplifying to the Ugandan government what true Christianity means.

The UK Foreign and Commonwealth Office warns travellers to avoid parts of Uganda altogether except for strictly necessary purposes. The so-called Lords Resistance Army and spill-over from the civil war in the adjoining DRC, make parts of Uganda hazardous.

Uganda hosts the largest refugee population in Africa, over 2 million including from neighbouring South Sudan. Uganda is a third world country, yet we in affluent Britain complain about too many immigrants.

MAF Uganda flies 4 times per week to Arua providing access to the Bidibidi refugee settlement which houses 270,000 refugees. One project which MAF makes possible through its link with Brass for Africa is to provide musical instruments for children. Lots of refugee children have learnt to play brass instruments for relaxation and it also enables them to make a living. Making music has a wonderful effect in releasing trauma and improving mental health. The number of suicides in the camp has dropped dramatically.

How Is 30 Years of the Fairtrade Mark Being Celebrated This Year?

Thirty years ago this year, Green and Black's Maya Gold chocolate hit the shelves, followed shortly by Cafedirect coffee, Percol coffee and Clipper tea.

These were the first products in the UK to carry the Fairtrade mark, a guarantee that the tea, coffee, cocoa and sugar farmers had been paid a fair price for their product. A response to the collapse of global coffee prices in the late 1980s, it marked the beginning of a movement that now supports over two million farmers and workers in 58 countries.

As well as providing a fair living for the people who actually produce our staple products, communities throughout the world have benefited from help with such things as education, training, health centres, improved housing and infrastructure, environmental improvements and climate change mitigation.

Michael Gidney, CEO of the Fairtrade Foundation, says: "The incredible public support for Fairtrade has been an inspiration. Hundreds of companies have responded, with thousands of Fairtrade products available in supermarkets, cafés and workplaces across the country. This is the result of many people, over many years, playing their part in making the UK a fairer place. Thank you for standing shoulder to shoulder with producers."

The Fairtrade movement has been embraced enthusiastically by faith groups, including the Church of Scotland, since the beginning. At local level the congregation in Letham have signed up as a Fairtrade church, pledging to use Fairtrade products in their own activities.

Marking the 30th anniversary of the Fairtrade movement in the UK, the annual Fairtrade Fortnight will be from September 9-22. The theme of Fairtrade Fortnight is 'Be the Change', encouraging people to choose Fairtrade goods whenever possible. This coincides with Creation Time (September 1 – October 4), when churches are encouraged to have a focus on caring for God's creation.

On 15th September there will be a Fairtrade Breakfast at the Church in Letham at 9:30am. Please come and enjoy some Fairtrade products for breakfast.



TALES OF LETHAM STANES No. 7

T've seen many a ruined building,

but never a ruined stane." (Hugh McDiarmid)

STANES FROM THE DEMOLISHED KIRKDEN ADORN THE FRONTAGES OF HOUSES ON EAST DEN BRAE.

In the year 1952, Kirkden kirk was demolished.

The houses on the right hand side (going downhill) on East Den Brae were about to be built, on sloping land. This land was secured by building substantial frontages with the stone from the downtakings from the recently demolished kirk at Kirkden.

So, from looking down on our devout forebears at their solemn Sabbath services, weddings and funerals for 100 years or more, (does anyone know when the kirk was built?) the purpose of these old stones was changed to supporting the many family homes on East Den Brae.

A task these stones have fulfilled admirably to this day, 72 years later. We salute them.

Demolition of the kirk was not a complete razed to the ground event. A part of the wall remains and that is topped by the kirk bell. Colourful aubrietias sprout from the walls and flower gloriously in the springtime, and this all sits alongside the ancient graveyard where the gravestones make very interesting reading of times gone past

The old kirk is worthy of inspection - it is open at no charge. The walk can begin on East Den Brae to see the great stonework in front of the houses, go downhill Into the Den and cross the Vinney. You can get to Kirkden via the entrance road at the bottom of Grant Roy's brae.

After visiting the kirk you can walk along the path in a westerly direction, cross the Vinney and go up the brae to join Braehead road and Gardyne Street by the school.
