## FOOD PROJECT BACKGROUND - AND HOW TO ACCESS SUPPORT FROM IT

#### **Background:**

We thought it would be helpful to provide some background to the Food Project which we now support. It started in 2016 after the Rev Dr Karen Fenwick, (the then Minister of Lowson Memorial Church) began to experience an increase in the number of people knocking on the door of the Manse with pleas for help to get food. A group of volunteers rallied round to form a Food Project Group. Pat McDonald was asked to coordinate this and from funds donated by members of the congregation was able to gain the support of local food suppliers.

In 2020 Covid-19 struck and everywhere was in lock-down but the Food Project group continued to support those in need, and on a much larger scale as the list of those requiring support grew – at that time over 50 households (approximately 120 people).

God was at work and the Church had huge support from Greggs, Strathmore Foods, Saddlers the Bakers, Aldi, Tesco, ASDA and the Angus Upcycling Project, with St. Margaret's and East and Old Churches all handing in bags of food. All of the above have continued to support this work.

This Food Project would not have been a success without a willing band of helpers. They collect food nightly on a rota basis from the food stores and deliver twice weekly in all kinds of weather. It is a Food Project not a Foodbank as food parcels are delivered - the families don't collect from the church. Monetary donations continue to be received from various individuals and organisations and these enable the Project to prop up or supply the store with food bags, labels etc.

#### **How to access support:**

The contact email for immediate support is pat@strathdeveron.co.uk or lowsonchurch@gmail.com

If anyone from Letham makes contact, food parcels can be made up and someone from Letham will collect the bags and deliver the food to the families. We can discuss with individuals how this can be done. If it is a one off delivery there will be tea, coffee, milk, cereal or porridge, tins of soup, peas, fresh vegetables, fruit, pasta bake, Bolognese Sauce, beans & sausages, beans, rice, spaghetti, bread, rolls, frozen meals, eg. chicken pieces, fish fingers and ready-made meals when these are available. It depends what is in the freezers. If families require more than one delivery, arrangements can be discussed for this. The items mentioned above are what is provided weekly. Non perishable goods are better so UHT milk, cereal, tins of soup, fruit, bolognese sauce, beans etc are especially welcomed from contributors such as the members of Letham Church.

The aim of this initiative has always been to support where possible by giving a hand up rather than a handout in the hope that this will see individuals and families through difficult and tough times while they manage their budgets, priorities and circumstances through change. PLEASE CONTINUE TO SUPPORT THIS IN ANY WAY YOU CAN.

Sadly, we lost two of Letham's well-known residents this year. They moved to Letham 36 years ago and immediately got involved in the local community and village events.

**Phyllis's c**ontribution to the local community is incalculable.

She was part of Letham Pensioners for 30 years, and for more than 20 years she was their president, a role she thoroughly enjoyed, although she never ever saw herself as a pensioner. She particularly loved organising the bus trips, Christmas party and the Johny A Thing to raise funds each year.

She was part of a group who ran the lunch club, and every week she would be at Jubilee Court helping to serve meals until this well loved and social event unfortunately ended. The Letham Seniors as The Pensioners are now known have started a social event every Friday afternoon in the church hall, where anyone can come for a cup of tea or coffee and chat, the sort of event which Phyllis would have loved.

Phyllis was also on the hall committee for as long as anyone can remember and helped informally at the Basement when they were short of volunteers and for all her endeavours was a worthy winner of the Cosgrove Award.

Dennis was part of the Feuars' Committee and would enjoy dressing up as Santa at village Christmas events, and as George Dempster - the village founding father at local events. When he was physically able, he helped to put up the village square Christmas lights and as a mark of respect following his death, the village flag was flown at half-mast in the square. He was on the Community Council for over 20 years, including a stint as chairman. Perhaps his biggest achievement for the village was being part of the group who were instrumental in organising the set up of the health hub at Jubilee Court. He also went round raising money for the first defibrillators in Letham, and who can remember him getting his beard half shaved off for this.

Both Phyllis and Dennis were a big part of Letham and will be sadly missed by not just their family and friends but by the Village who they both served for so many years and called home.

#### TALES OF LETHAM STANES No. 8

"I've seen many a ruined building, but never a ruined stane." (Hugh McDiarmid)

A DOLMEN IN IRELAND ERECTED
TO COMMEMORATE MONASTERBOICE
CONNECTIONS WITH LETHAM. (Part 1)

What is a Dolmen, you may well ask?

An Irishman once described a Dolmen as a VERY large picnic table. There are several Dolmens to be found all over Ireland. They were erected hundreds of years ago - no one knows why. Like Scotland's cup and ring stones, (our Girdle Stane for example), their purpose and reason for being, is unknown. But we do know they are over 3,500 years old.... older than the pyramids.

How can Letham lay claim to such an ancient thing in Ireland?

As the year 2000 loomed into view, all communities were urged to mark the beginning of this special century. Here in Letham we twinned with Monasterboice in Ireland. After all we had connection with Monsterboice from the year 400 AD.

How to commemorate this new century? Our twins in Ireland found a set of stones in a farmer's field. They may have been a collapsed Dolmen from yesteryear. They decided to re-instate these stones into a 'modern' Dolmen.

Here we reciprocated by creating in steel, a replica of what is known as the Kirkbuddo Stane which is a Pictish Christian Cross. This replica was made by a local craftsman, the late Jake McBride, and galvanised in Forfar. This cross was erected at Crosston Farm. It was erected with a time capsule buried below it. Amongst many other artefacts the capsule contains the names of all the Letham school pupils of the year 2000.

The cross still stands at Crosston Farm.

#### TALES OF LETHAM STANES No. 7

T've seen many a ruined building,

but never a ruined stane." (Hugh McDiarmid)

STANES FROM THE DEMOLISHED KIRKDEN ADORN THE FRONTAGES OF HOUSES ON EAST DEN BRAE.

In the year 1952, Kirkden kirk was demolished.

The houses on the right hand side (going downhill) on East Den Brae were about to be built, on sloping land. This land was secured by building substantial frontages with the stone from the downtakings from the recently demolished kirk at Kirkden.

So, from looking down on our devout forebears at their solemn Sabbath services, weddings and funerals for 100 years or more, (does anyone know when the kirk was built?) the purpose of these old stones was changed to supporting the many family homes on East Den Brae.

A task these stones have fulfilled admirably to this day, 72 years later. We salute them.

Demolition of the kirk was not a complete razed to the ground event. A part of the wall remains and that is topped by the kirk bell. Colourful aubrietias sprout from the walls and flower gloriously in the springtime, and this all sits alongside the ancient graveyard where the gravestones make very interesting reading of times gone past

The old kirk is worthy of inspection - it is open at no charge. The walk can begin on East Den Brae to see the great stonework in front of the houses, go downhill Into the Den and cross the Vinney. You can get to Kirkden via the entrance road at the bottom of Grant Roy's brae.

After visiting the kirk you can walk along the path in a westerly direction, cross the Vinney and go up the brae to join Braehead road and Gardyne Street by the school.
