CONGREGATIONAL REPORT 2024 PUBLICITY GROUP

The first thing to report is that the Publicity Group of Dunnichen, Letham & Kirkden Church no longer exists. As a consequence of the Union, we are now part of the All Souls Communications Committee.

In common with our own previous practice, there are a number of Committees which sit under, and report to, the new All Souls Kirk Session. In addition to Communication, these are: Finance, Property, Worship (and Discipleship), Mission and Outreach, Pastoral Care, Social, Safeguarding and Youth and Children. All 10 of the Elders from legacy DLK Church sit on one or more of these Committees and you will hear more about their work in coming months.

However, our previous initiatives continue more or less unaltered, as you may have noticed. The same group of local people co-ordinate the funding, production and distribution of "In the PICTure" - our church and community newsletter. 1,000 copies of the magazine will continue to be printed 10 times a year, and delivered free of charge to all households in the parish, thanks to our very willing volunteer distributors. Those who live outwith the Parish and have requested a copy are sent an electronic pdf version.

Our other activities were all successfully implemented again this year and will continue: delivery of an Easter Card with the March edition; updated copies of the "In the Know" leaflet aimed at providing useful information for both newcomers to the village and more long term residents going out with the September edition, and in October we organise the annual Envelope Appeal, which (assisted by Gift Aid) brings in a huge contribution towards the printing costs of the magazine – which are currently £206.28 per month.

But we could not achieve a satisfactory funding situation without our 16 loyal sponsors - the local businesses who financially support the magazine ensuring that "In the PICTure" is not a drain on the Church's resources.

Local organisations have increasingly taken the opportunity offered by "In the PICTure" to publicise their activities or special events either via an article, or an advert or sometimes through a special leaflet inserted into the magazine. This will be enhanced by highlighting events and activities in our partner churches in the All Souls Union.

The work involved in collating, editing, liaising with sponsors and occasional advertisers, proof-reading, bundling and delivering would not be possible without the commitment of our team who are Rev Martyn Thomas, Joan Smith, Elaine Saunders, Jeannie Mair and Irene McGugan.

Finally a huge thank you to all who support this significant outreach initiative of the Church. *Irene McGugan All Souls Communications*



TALES OF LETHAM STANES No. 9

"*I've seen many a ruined building, but never a ruined stane.*" (Hugh McDiarmid)

A DOLMEN IN IRELAND ERECTED TO COMMEMORATE MONASTERBOICE CONNECTIONS WITH LETHAM. (Part 2)

Meantime our Irish twins were enjoying much more drama erecting their Dolmen. A Dolmen consists of 4 large stones. Three are securely embedded in the ground, forming the legs of the large picnic table, whilst the fourth stone is perched atop.

Modern rules and regulations require the 'table top' and the 'legs' to be bored to accommodate steel rods, ensuring that the several tonne top does not fall off and kill someone. This involved a mason's yard. Once all this mason's yard preparation had taken place, an ancient tractor pulling an equally ancient trailer arrived to convey the stones, (which may have been a fallen Dolmen from ancient times) to its new site.

This was an impossibly very heavy load. The tractor driver made for the just constructed motorway leading from Dublin to Belfast. This was the quickest route to the erection site. The tractor's old driver was completely unaware that an ancient tractor moving very slowly, pulling an overweight load of big stones weighing several tonnes, on a rickety trailer, was banned from entering a motorway.

The inevitable happened, and the trailer got a puncture. Motorway users speeding (now slowly) to Dublin were greatly delayed. The incident got top spot in the traffic report on the radio. This all happened two days before the Letham contingent arrived. The Dolmen was duly erected and inaugurated. At the inauguration ceremony the visitors from Letham and their Monasterboice twins were rightfully impressed with this Dolmen, erected in Letham's honour.

I know that the series about stanes tells of the stones of Letham, however I had to talk of Letham's Dolmen in Ireland, which consists of four very heavy, long stones. With the stainless steel retaining rods, the Letham Dolmen in Ireland will outlast all of us. It too has a time capsule about Monasterboice buried below it. AMcG

JustGiving

My name is Karen and I am fund raising on behalf of the Letham and District Community Council (LDCC). One of our LDCC objectives is to provide and maintain defibrillators within our community for the use and benefit of everyone in our community.

Around 70 people each week have a cardiac arrest at home in Scotland (St Johns Ambulance). As a nurse I am well aware of the benefits of early intervention when people take unwell suddenly and I am sure most people will have a family member or friend who has suffered a cardiac arrest. A defibrillator can make all the difference in these situations, especially in a rural location when professional help may take some time.

Currently in Letham we have 3 defibrillators, one in the Square, which is accessible 24 hours, one in the Keystore and one at Davidsons the chemist, however the latter two are only accessible during business hours. It is our ambition at the LDCC to have all 3 accessible 24 hours a dav. We would also like to widen availability to some of the smaller communities within our district like Craichie and Bowriefauld.

Our Just giving online target of £1,325 has been achieved. This will get us 1 defibrillator and 2 outdoor cabinets, we have very generously been supported by the Football trust and Davidsons chemist's with donations towards this cause, however all donations above our target will be held in the defibrillator account of the LDCC and used to replace the current defibrillators which are coming to the end of their lifespan, also to replace batteries and AED pads when required to ensure this vital equipment is available at the time of need.

We would really appreciate any donation you can offer and will continue to collect cash donations which are currently being collected in the Letham Keystore. Donations can also be given to any of the LDCC committee members.
