

#### TALES OF LETHAM STANES No. 17

"I've seen many a ruined building, but never a ruined stane." (Hugh MacDiarmid) "NEARBY OUARRIES"

Anent my thoughts on dry stane dykes last month, I began to think about where the stones of my childhood were sourced round about Letham village. Given that the need for stones like those used for dry stane dykes had peaked many years ago, we can simply record quarries around Letham which continued to fulfill small requirements. All of these are now closed up but their ancient sites can be recalled.

Quarries were always located where the covering of earth was thin, and the stones were accessible and near to the surface. We can only imagine that the quarries of the past were sources of material for dry stane dyking, and the foundations of buildings and roadways.

The biggest quarry was Crosston Quarry (a big deep hole – water filled at the bottom). Long since filled in, the area is now used as a storage place for piles of stones and other requirements of such a nature, needed by a big farming concern like Drummietermont Farm. In its closing years, the big deep hole was used as a dumping ground for all sorts of industrial, commercial and household rubbish. Its present condition is not nearly the visual shock to the eye as it used to present.

We also had in the early days of the founding of the village, a quarry down by what was the Haulker Den Dam which used to provide stored water for Plashmill in The Den. There is a small quarry which burrowed into the hillside at Hillend of Lownie, which now accommodates an agricultural building. There used to be a quarry at Carmyllie crossroads on Black of Backboath land. This quarry hole has now been restored to an agricultural field.

But we cannot pass quarries by without mentioning the extensive quarrying which took place in Carmyllie. A railway line ran from Arbroath Harbour to Carmyllie, aince errant, for the purpose of exporting Carmyllie flagstones to worldwide destinations. It is fascinating to note that subsequent to World War II, the city of Cologne was almost flattened due to heavy and persistent Allied bombing. The Dom Kirche, in the centre of the city, amazingly, was only partially damaged. A third of the floor was replaced with Carmyllie flagstones. And if you go to the Dom Kirche, you will find a notice on one of the pillars confirming this fact that these Carmyllie stones were used in the restoration of this Kirk.

Finally, many a pig's cree was constructed with quarry stones and topped off with a very large (must have been awfy heavy) Carmyllie flagstone. Letham pigs must have lived in luxury!

On behalf of the Letham and District community council (LDCC) we are delighted to update that work is complete on the installation of a Defibrillator on the outside of the building at Jubilee Court, this will allow villagers to access this vital piece of life saving equipment 24 hours a day. Many thanks to Angus Council for working with the LDCC to achieve this for the benefit of our community.

In total we now have defibrillators with 24 hour access on the following sites:

## In the Square on the Feuars building (under the clock)

#### Outside Davidsons Chemists on Blairs Road On the outside wall at Jubilee court On the outside wall of Mains of Craichie farm building

All of our defibrillators are accessed with a key code. When you call 999 you will be advised where the nearest unit is in relation to your location and you will be given a key code to access the defibrillator.

We would not have been able to achieve any of this without all the support we have received! So once again a huge thank you to all who donated to our cause and lent their services and expertise to support with installation.

Fund raising for the maintenance and replacement of defibrillator equipment will be ongoing so if anyone is interested in making a donation please feel free to discuss with any members of the LDCC.

Letham Bowling Club also has a defibrillator, courtesy of the family of the late Mr. Brian Milne. Operational access is exactly the same system as described for the LDCC defibrillators. To obtain the defibrillator, enter Bowling Club via the gate, turn right and it is sited on the wall of the dressing room facing the bowling green. The site is automatically lit.
