Dear Residents

Here is an update of what we are trying to do for you, how you can get involved and what you can do for each other.

CHRISTMAS

The Christmas social went well on a cold December night. A big thank you to all who attended and everyone who helped make it a successful evening. We have provisionally booked Friday 6th December 2013 and would welcome ideas for the next one.

Christmas Lights made our Estate a joy to behold and the cash prizes help to pay for the electricity, lights and bulbs.

MOSQUE

We received a response to our complaints in late November from Hounslow Council and we have gone back to them to say we are still not impressed with their actions. The mosque opened having not complied with the need for an agreed travel plan and have also been in breach of their planning consent with regard to the unauthorised dome structure and excessive signage. We continue to fight on these issues.

MONOLITH

This dreadful monstrosity was erected back in April 2009 and it took us over 3 years, with the help of councillor Beverley Williams, to get Hounslow Council to agree to measure the tower and discover that it was 6 metres + taller than the agreed height! Hounslow Council eventually issued a demolition notice back in the June 2012 and the tower owners, JC Decaux, appealed with the hearing eventually going ahead on 7th January 2013. The Planning Inspectorate have confirmed that this dreadful structure is outside of the agreed permission and that it must come down!! JC Decaux have until early March to apply for a review at the High Court or complete the demolition by 8th August.

NOTICE BOARDS

As explained we are not supposed to use trees/telegraph poles to broadcast information. Look out for the TERA notice boards paid for by a grant from Hounslow Council following support from our local councillors Beverley Williams & Rebecca Stewart. Noticeboards are located at the petrol station end of Raleigh, the corner of Sunbury/Shakespeare and at the junction of Queens Way/Avenue. We need a home for another notice board at the Air Park end of Queens/Castle and if you are able to help please let a committee member know. If you are a TERA member and have a notice to display please feel free to do so.

To save on delivery and more importantly on printing costs future newsletters will only be delivered to TERA members and posted on the boards.

PETROL STATION

Partially due to our input, the application for a licence to sell alcohol and hot food overnight has been refused by Hounslow Council. It is most definitely in *all of our interests* to support this local shop but the request to be able to provide food and alcohol throughout the night was not.

BURGLARIES/NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

In a 3 month period there have been 8 burglaries: 3 in Elizabeth Way, 2 in Queens Way, 1 in Seymour Gardens, 1 in Raleigh Way and 1 in Castle Way. There are also reports of one in Shakespeare Way. There have also been 2 thefts of catalytic converters (part of exhaust system) from large vans on the Estate. Several trespasses have occurred at an address in Queens Way. We are not alone, there have also been thefts in Tudor Court and Fernside. The Police have promised to increase patrols both obvious and not so.

Look out for a lady jogger taking photos of the fronts of houses for her father who lives abroad and a suspicious male wearing sunglasses and a woolly hat aimlessly cycling around the Estate.

We still need to be extremely vigilant and report anything that looks wrong or 'out of place'. Please feel free to put any information in the letter boxes of Nic Moore (3, Elizabeth Way) or Brian Smith (16 Sunbury Way).

CLEAN-UP

TERA have applied to the Clean-up London campaign, being run by the Mayor of London's office, and the Environment Agency, for a litter picking pack. If successful we can use for a litter pick around our Estate mainly near the A316 where the rubbish gets trapped in the bushes.

20 MPH ZONE

In our last newsletter we mentioned the possibility of trying to get Hounslow Council to make this a 20 mile per hour zone. This would not involve humps but just a general restriction regarding speed on the Estate. So far we have only received positive comments. Please let us have your views.
