MOSQUE

The travel plan which was a requirement before the mosque was supposed to open is still outstanding but is due to be agreed in the near future. The excessive signage which is outside of planning permission is subject to an appeal and is with the Planning Inspectorate at Bristol. The dome which was erected without planning permission and is subject to an enforcement notice is also with the Planning Inspectorate at Bristol and we await their decision. Our complaint with regard to the way that Hounslow Council has dealt with this since the outset is still not resolved and is fuelled by the fact that we have recently discovered the Ahmaddiya Muslim Association invoiced our council for £11,957.50 in relation to the costs application at ASI House because they were not initially given planning permission without having to make the appeal.

OLD RAC SITE NEAR HANWORTH PARK HOUSE

A logistics depot is due to be built on this site. We are asking Hounslow Council to put a lorry ban (except for access) on Castle Way and Sunbury Way to ensure the additional traffic is routed behind the estate and to stop lorries parking in the roadway outside the petrol station because it makes the exit from Raleigh Way very dangerous.

HOUNSLOW HIGHWAYS

Footpath 2014 – Seymour, Sunbury

Footpath 2015 & 2016 - Nil

Footpath 2017 – Queens Avenue

Roadway 2013 & 2014 - Nil

Roadway 2015 – Queens Avenue

Roadway 2016 – Sunbury, Castle

Roadway 2017 – Queens Way, Blakewood, Elizabeth, Seymour, Moat Side, Shakespeare

PLANNING APPLICATION FOR FOOTBALL PITCHES

We submitted 97 letters of objection to the proposed installation of seven five-a-side and three seven-a-side pitches with ancillary buildings on the other side of the A316 from Sunbury Way. It is likely that there will be a public presentation of the plans in the next month or so and we will do our best to advise you of the date in advance. It seems that Hounslow Council are minded to give this the go ahead despite local opposition on both sides of the A316.
