Traffic / Pedestrian News

Hounslow Council along with all other London Boroughs have gone ahead with making all residential estates 20 miles an hour areas. The 20 miles an hour applies to **ALL OF US**, our visitors, and everyone else using our roads and is for our mutual benefit and safety.

After a considerable delay LBH have at last gone ahead with allowing the residents of Sunbury Way and Castle Way to park partially on the walkway.

We are ecstatic to say that at long last and after many requests from TERA the missing H25 bus stop in Sunbury Way is being installed. LBH/TfL have gone for the cheap option ignoring the effect on the traffic and pedestrian safety and have not cut the bus stop fully into the available land. After all these years any bus stop is better than none and this will be of great benefit to all.

Unfortunately we still do not have any meaningful progress regarding the need for zebra crossings on Sunbury Way and the slip-roads to the A316. TfL/LBH are still waiting for somebody to be killed before they do anything so please don't let it be you or yours. So we can only say again please be careful when crossing these dangerous roads.
