Subscriptions are started again after the Covid period raising £580 for the year. There were a substantial amount of donations, £540, which adding to the events income in the year created total income of £2189 for the year. The income was not enough to cover the total expenses for the year £2316.15 leaving £ 774.40 in the bank and £340.31 in cash at the end of year.

In the past year we have invested in a mobile payments device so are now able to accept in-person payments digitally as well as using cash at events such as our AGM. We are also able to accept bank transfers.
