Updates from committee members follow:

Nic Moore - Chair

Muller Dairy Roundabout

For more than 10 years, the committee has been campaigning for pedestrian crossings on the A316 slip roads and are disappointed that TFL are claiming lack of funding for their inaction. We will continue to campaign to make these slip roads safer to cross.

We have also recently successfully campaigned for an improvement in lighting and removal of weeds at the roundabout which we are pleased to say was completed a few weeks ago.

E-bike parking in Elizabeth Way

We are grateful for the 82 signatures we received on our petition against the e-bike parking bay on Elizabeth Way. We have complained to the council over the past 18 months to remove the parking bay as the parking bay was due to be made permanent only <u>after</u> a resident's consultation, which has not happened.

Our collective view is that the parking bay is infrequently used and would be better off in a different location. We believe the local councillors have finally got the message and we are hoping that this will be resolved in our favour in the near future.

Hole in the grass verge at crossroads of Shakespeare Way x Queens Way

We are pleased to see that this hole has finally been filled following nine months of the committee complaining to London Borough of Hounslow.

Double yellow lines on the one-way section of Raleigh Way

We understand that there will be a consultation sometime 'in the near future' about the installation of double yellow lines in the one way section of Raleigh Way near the petrol station. We've been pushing to get this completed to stop cars parking there and blocking access, particularly for emergency vehicles.

Portlane Brook - Lack of water and fly tipping

We have attended at least three site meetings over the last year alone however this is still a 'work in progress'.

Hanworth Area Forum meetings

Our chair Nic has attended every Hanworth Area Forum meeting over the last 2-year period, ever since it devolved from the previous Feltham, Bedfont, and Hanworth area forum meetings. He has frequently raised issues that are relevant to our immediate area, however anybody can attend these meetings are we actively encourage residents to attend.
