In groundbreaking news this week, the International Court of Justice (ICJ), the UN court that hears cases on international conflicts, has ruled that Israel's occupation of Palestinian territories (West Bank and East Jerusalem) is illegal and other countries should not support it. This ruling is not easily enforceable but it will provide more justification for international pressure on Israel and its allies, just as the ICJ's preliminary ruling on the genocide in Gaza has done.

Though the US media has shifted to analyzing the US presidential race, Israel continues to devastate Gaza with US support. The bombing attacks have only intensified, including on UN schools where people are sheltering and on designated safe zones. Palestinians in Gaza are dying from this violence and also from famine, disease, and lack of medical care, while the US continues to send bombs to Israel and withhold funds from UNRWA.

One bright spot is that the newly elected government in the UK has restored its funding for UNRWA, the main humanitarian organization in Gaza. "An unprecedented five independents defeated Labour candidates and became MPs, all bar Corbyn Muslim, all campaigning on a platform firmly centred on Gaza and Palestine." This demonstrates the importance of elections in shaping policy that directly influences people's lives. We continue to press for full restoration of US funding to UNRWA. It is important for us to continue to exert pressure both outside and inside our political system to stop the flow of US weapons to Israel and to end this genocide now.

This coming week, an important action will take place in D.C. on the day of Netanyahu's address to Congress. Please see more information below, including about Southern Vermont for Palestine's solidarity action for those who can't attend in person. This action includes readings from young people's testimonies of their experiences living in Gaza from the project <u>We Are Not Numbers</u>.
