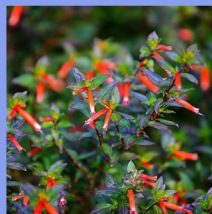


CELEBRATING AMERICA 250

More than 14,000 fireworks light up American skies each July 4.



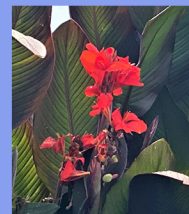

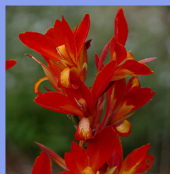

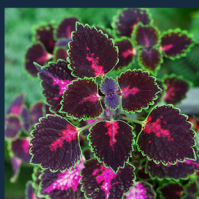
Capsicum annuum

PHILADELPHIA ROAD TRIP

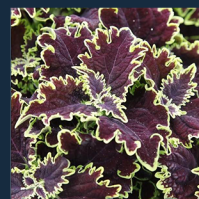
The United States consists of over 4 million miles of public roads, allowing Americans to traverse the country by car.
