

Kings Ridge Community Association

Report to Huntington HOA Board from Board Representative Tom Guequierre October 2021

Note: This report is general information for our residents. It is not an official record of the Kings Ridge Community Association nor is it a full and complete account of same. Check the Web site, Royal Times and/or other sources for official records for more information. While I do attempt to provide accurate information and avoid bias others could have a different recollection or view.

I attended the Neighborhood Network meeting on September 2nd. I attended the KRCA Budget workshop on September 8th. I took a webinar sponsored by Leland Management on Pets & Communities on September 9th. I attended the KRCA Communications Committee meeting on September 10th. I attended the Huntington Board meeting on September 16th. The Regular Monthly KRCA Board meeting was held on Wednesday September 22nd. 14 of the 15 Board members were present. Listed will be items the Board took action on during the meeting along with some general information.

General Information: Two persons announced that they would be recording the meeting.

Under Financial Reports: Through the end of August, the HOA Budget is running about 102K favorable as salaries, grounds repairs and irrigation system repairs are running below plan. The Clubhouse Budget is about 67k favorable as staff vacancies, clubhouse utilities and pool expenses account for much of this condition. As the clubhouse continues reopening the vacancies will be refilled although it has been difficult to obtain replacements. We also have several projects and repairs coming up yet this year.

The remainder of the Clubhouse Roof Repair is being done by Susan McCarthy Roofing Contractor. The Board voted to have the remaining \$9,702 taken out of reserves.

Under Old business: A brief report was given on the North Spa renovation. We are still waiting for some materials, painting and are still working on getting proper ventilation of some areas.


Discussion on the proposed addition of more house paint colors. The proposed colors were posted. attempts have been made to meet with neighborhoods. (Not all neighborhoods responded) It is planned to have the proposal voted on at the October meeting.

<u>Under New business</u>: Presented was information on the continued landscaping and improvement of the neighborhood entry wall areas between 2021 & 2022. The Board voted to approve continuing the work and to approve an amount not to exceed \$28,000 from reserves for additional landscaping.


Presentation of several legal matter situations were made by Association Attorney Ruggieri. First up was a conformation of the Boards Power to approve changes and appoint co-chair positions in

the ACC. One suggestion is to have three co-chair positions and divide the neighborhoods between them rather than having one chair responsible for all. Discussion resulted in no action taken at this time but it will be put on a future agenda. Next up under the legal update was a discussion of common areas and ownership of a number of parcels that appear may belong to the Golf Course but are maintained by the Association and adjacent or enclosed by Association property. The Board voted to approve further looking into the process of determining ownership and looking into the possibility of working with the golf course to have such areas transferred to Association ownership. Once the process gets to that stage the Board will have to approve after which the neighborhood voting members of the designated 45 will also have to approve it. Continuing with legal matters due to Florida Law changes a few changes in the Community Association Assessment Collection Policy were presented by our Attorney. The Board voted to approve same. More legal discussion continues, our Attorney advised that as a matter of periodic accepted practices that it was time to have the Board officially vote to ratify the ACC guidelines currently in place. This does not make changes in them it only ratifies them as officially approved. The Board voted to make such approval. Leaving the legal update portion next up was approval in some membership changes on the ACC. Jeff Gardner resigned and three new members were proposed. The new members are Bucky Hough, Mike Whaley and Peter McGow. The Board voted to approve the new members. It was announced that three Resident Comment boxes would soon be put out. One in the clubhouse, one in the North Spa and one that would go out in the neighborhood board meetings if the neighborhood approved. The comment program is called "What's on Your Mind". Initially this is a 3-month trial period. (Note: More Information will be posted in the October Royal Times) As is required the 2022 proposed Community Association budget is presented at the September meeting for preliminary approval. The proposed budget will result in no increase of monthly fees from 2021 remaining at \$173 a month. The Board voted unanimously for the preliminary approval. The 2022 Budget Meeting for final approval will be held at the October Board meeting on the 27th. Notices will be sent to the residents. Committee & Miscellaneous Information: This report is getting quite long so I will try and be brief. A report was received from the Ballroom renovation Committee. Electrical work complete, sound system work starting, carpet was approved and ordered with expected January install, Fabric for chair reupholster ordered. Larger TV's yet to be ordered. Reports were received from the ACC, Communications Committee, City Council, CERB, CEC and Traffic Committee. Board approved a request from the finance Committee to have a reserve study done next year, cost at \$7,200. Will also be getting a civil engineer to evaluate roads and costs of resurfacing them when needed. Open Forum Information: A concern was expressed about both cars and golf carts often not properly stopping and proceeding around the Chapel Hill Fountain circle. A resident mentioned that the Florida Flag in the Veterans Memorial are needs replacement. Another concern was made about the condition of some trees around the parking lot. It was pointed out that South Lake Tree will soon be attending to them and removing as needed. A concern also made about the condition of the Palms at our Main Entryway; it was pointed out again that Kings Ridge does not own the property. It may be one of the parcels we seek transfer mentioned earlier under new business. End of meeting, next full meeting was set for October 27th. Take care Huntington and stay Healthy! ***




Resident name on mailbox
