B. Scholarship Eligibility

For Prince George's County Public School Students

Application must be emailed to Education@ncbwpgc.net by Friday, July 26, 2024, 11:59 P.M. EST

- 1. Applicant must be a graduating 2024 high school senior attending one of Prince George's County Public High Schools.
- 2. A Black female.
- 3. Must be a resident of Prince George's County Maryland.
- 4. Submit a copy of the official acceptance letter from the college or university.
- 5. Have and maintained a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.
- 6. Submit an official transcript that contains the cumulative GPA for the 2023-2024 school year. The official transcript must be emailed directly from student's school to NCBW Prince George's County Chapter, Inc.: Education@ncbwpgc.net.
- 7. Submit a copy of completed verified community service hours.
- 8. Agree to participate in the Give-Back Initiative 10 hours of service to NCBW Prince George's County Chapter, Inc. (Please read Section D of the application).
- 9. A Financial need is a factor in awarding this scholarship; therefore, a 2023 W-2 from the applicant's parent/guardian will be required.
- 10. A copy of the student's school ID.
- 11. Cannot be related to a member of NCBW Prince George's County Chapter, Inc.
- 12. Submit a typed one-page 250-word essay, double-spaced in Arial 12-font to address one of the following prompts:

Prompt 1: Bullying

Discuss how you or someone you know has worked to reduce bullying in your community or school. How was this achieved and how can these methods be applied to a larger-scale situation?

Prompt 2: Artificial Intelligence (AI) in Education for Black Women and Girls; AI refers to computer systems capable of performing complex tasks that historically only a human could do, such as reasoning, making decisions, or solving problems.

Al literacy is especially important for those who may not be well-represented in technology design. Please describe your perceptions around fair and accountable Al and how it can have an empowered role in the creation of Al.



C. Submission Process

Application with required documents must be signed and dated by the student and parent. Application packets must be emailed to Education@ncbwpgc.net by Friday, July 26, 2024, 11:59 P.M. EST.

Incomplete and late applications will not be accepted.

D. Award Decision

- 1. Candidates will go through an interviewing process. This will be a mandatory 30-minute virtual meeting. Candidates must be available to meet with the NCBW Prince George's County Chapter, Inc., Education Scholarship Committee during the weeks of August 5, 2024.
- 2. The scholarship recipients will be awarded \$1000 annually, totaling \$4,000 over four years.

The student must maintain a minimum of a 2.5 GPA or higher while enrolled in a full-time academic program with an accredited college or university.

Give-Back Initiative - Complete a cumulative 10 hours of community service hours with NCBW Prince George's County Chapter, Inc. This can be accomplished during the student's academic breaks and/or during the summer months. The Service Hour Commitment Agreement will be discussed in detail during the interview process.

3. Scholarship recipients will be announced, and award letters will be emailed by August 12, 2024.
