Senator-At-Large Angel Bolques Jr. Praises EPA's Rigorous Water Quality Study in St. Croix

St. Croix — Senator-At-Large Angel Bolques Jr. commended the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for its detailed study on the drinking water quality in St. Croix under Project Number 2311021. This project, spearheaded by John R. Bourbon, Chief of the Laboratory Services and Applied Science Division (LSASD) at the Region 2 Laboratory, represents a significant step forward in ensuring the safety and quality of drinking water in the region.

The EPA Region 2 Laboratory, accredited by the National Environmental Laboratory Accreditation Conference Institute (TNI), follows stringent guidelines to generate known and defensible environmental data. The report includes specific data qualifiers, such as U (undetected analyte), J (acceptable identification with an estimated value), K (potential high bias), L (potential low bias), and NJ (presumptive evidence with tentative identification), ensuring comprehensive analysis and reporting.

Senator Bolques concluded, "As we continue to prioritize the health and well-being of our citizens, this study serves as a vital resource. I assure the people of St. Croix that we will continue to monitor and collaboratively act on these findings to maintain and require the enhancement of our water quality. The GVI's collaboration with the EPA and other agencies will remain steadfast in this mission.
