My Office successfully organized site visits to the Arecibo Micro Grid in Puerto Rico with the Director of Energy for focused field discussions centered on enhancing energy resilience through innovative microgrid technology. This facility boasts a 5MW solar array and a 1.1MW battery storage system, designed to cut energy costs by 25% while boosting grid reliability in areas vulnerable to natural disasters. The visit featured a significant ribbon-cutting at Eaton's new facility, marking a major step forward in resilient clean energy solutions for Puerto Rico and perhaps even the Virgin Islands.



Networking with industry leaders like Mike Yelton, President, Electrical Sector of Eaton; Victor Mojica, Project Manager - Arecibo Micro Grid, Matt Barnes, Head of Enel Energy Systems America; esteemed Puerto Rican Senators, Omar J. Marrero Díaz, Secretary of State of Puerto Rico, Manuel Laboy Rivera, Secretary of the Department of Economic Development and Commerce and Executive Director of the Puerto Rico Industrial Development Company, Agustín F.
