Commends Honorable Delegate Plaskett, STX Farmers in Action, and partners for collaborative success

St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands – Senator Angel L. Bolques, Jr. is proud to join the Virgin Islands in celebrating the U.S. Department of Agriculture's approval of a waiver request that will unlock critical funding for the restoration of water infrastructure at the historic Estate Bethlehem site.
