Judi Nicolson fiddle (Scotland)



Scottish fiddler Judi Nicolson is a consummate performer, her dynamic fiddling, engaging stage presence, and deep understanding of Scotland's music has created a demand for her solo appearances, concerts and dances throughout the UK and Americas with a variety of groups.

Although classically trained from an early age, her passion was to play Traditional Scottish Fiddle Music. By the age of fifteen, she had won three major Open Scottish Fiddle Championships. Judi went on to play throughout the UK both as a soloist and with some of the finest Scottish Dance Bands. Ian Muir is one of the most accomplished and versatile accordionists in the Scottish music scene. His musical career has taken him all over the world performing in a variety of genres. Ian started his professional career aged 14 at the Gaiety Theatre, Ayr and since then, as well as his busy schedule in the UK, has travelled throughout Europe, the US and the Middle East.

He formed his own Scottish Dance Band in 1984, and broadcasts regularly for BBC Radio Scotland, and has made so many album recordings that he's lost count! Ian is also Senior Accordion Tutor at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland in Glasgow.

Kathy was born in Ste. Anne de Prescott, Ontario, Canada in a farming community near the Scottish settlement of Glengarry County, where she grew up surrounded by fiddlers, pipers and highland dancers. She began playing the piano at age 5 and was soon playing with a number of the local fiddlers and dance bands.

In the early 1970's, Kathy made the career choice of music educator and went on to receive a B. Mus from McGill University and a B. Ed from the University of Toronto. In 1976 she met Bobby Brown and spent the next 35 years touring and recording with The Scottish Accent and Cape Breton Symphony Fiddlers. Kathy was recently inducted into the Glengarry Celtic Music Hall of Fame and was honoured to be named Music Director for the 2015 and 2016 TAC Summer School.
