"Panboola is a diverse estuarine and freshwater wetland comprising billabongs, saline areas, a tidal channel, tidal mudflats, mangroves and saltmarsh. Remnant stands of forest red gums also exist along with vast areas of past grazing land undergoing revegetation... The initial vision for Panboola to be a beautiful refuge for waterbirds and all other native animals as well as a place where the local community and other humans can be inspired, educated and rested, has certainly been achieved."
