Youth Speaking Competition – “Lighting the Way for a Shared Future” Young people aged 11–16 years are invited to prepare and present either a 2–3 minute talk or a 2–3 minute spoken-word poetry piece inspired by the Inter Faith Week theme, “Lighting the Way for a Shared Future.” Participants are encouraged to creatively explore what the theme means to them and share their hopes and ideas for building greater understanding, friendship, peace and stronger communities.
