Welcome

Bouygues UK is working to the highest standards to mitigate disruption to residents as much as possible.

The purpose of this bulletin is to inform you of forthcoming works and any possible disturbances which might be caused by these works prior to their delivery.



Progress to date

- We continue with the facade works at ground level and on Level 1 on Building 7.
- The works to complete the internal fit out of dwellings and communal corridors are ongoing.
- We will be completing the hard and soft landscaping.
- We will be completing the play area.
- Works to complete the central hub are ongoing.
- We will complete the works to the staircase.
- We will continue the commissioning of the remaining lifts.



Forthcoming construction

It will soon be time for us to say goodbye to our site cabins.

Ahead of this, w/c 18th November we will take delivery of the temporary cabins that will house the remaining site team. These cabins will be placed on the future Phase 2 site.

The removal of our current cabins will begin w/c 2nd December. All lifting of the cabins will take place within the site boundary and should not cause any disruption to residents. The lorries which will be transporting the cabins are classed as abnormal loads and so we have approved dispensations in place to allow these on the highway.

The Ebury Bridge Time Capsule



The 25th October saw the culmination of weeks of collaborative effort from Bouygues UK, Westminster City Council, local residents, and students from St Barnabas' CE Primary School. Together, they brought to life a project that captures the history, spirit, stories, and everyday life of the Ebury Bridge Estate and the local area.

This initiative, led by Bouygues UK's Social Value team and supported by Westminster City Council, sought to encapsulate a broad range of items and information reflecting life in 2024. The project is a tribute to the people of Ebury and the surrounding area, capturing their voices, activities, and aspirations for future generations.

The celebration event saw all parties come together with counsellors and members of the community to pack the collected works into the capsule ahead of it's burial on the Phase One site.

The capsule is designed to last up to 100 years. It's planned to remain buried for 50 years, with the hope that the future generation might open it in 2075, either on a scheduled anniversary, as part of historical research, or even



by accident during future development. The team at Bouygues UK is proud to have been a part of this gift from one generation to the next.

The event at Ebury Bridge marks an inspiring chapter in the community's story. It is a powerful reminder of how communities evolve, adapt, and carry forward the memories and experiences of their residents.
