Parent Catechesis Passport (1-6)

Parents with students in grades 1-6 will be asked to complete a Family Passport again for the 24-25 school year. This passport is a way to help parents grow more in their own faith, as well as a way to take that growth home with them to their families.

Parents can fill their passports by attending Parent Catechesis sessions. These sessions will take place once a month in Coldwater, and once a month in FR at the **K of C Hall** (1302 Commerce Dr) during your child's CCD class (6:15-7:00pm). Dates for the Fort Recovery sessions are: Oct. 9th, Nov. 13th, Dec. 11th, Feb. 12th, Mar. 12th, and Apr. 9th. In these sessions, parents will learn more about what their children are learning, ways to catechize at home, different ways to pray with their families, and more!

We understand that Wednesdays do not work for everyone, so we have also included some alternative events, such as: Theologically Thirsty Thursdays, Faith Fueled Fridays, Cana Family, and Iron Sharpens Iron. If you have questions about another qualifying event, send Harlie an email!

Mass/Confession

Each CCD program will have **Confession and Adoration** twice throughout the year during their normal class time. The priests and students have enjoyed getting to know each other, therefore, priests will continue to stop by classrooms this school year to say hello and answer any questions the students may have!

Pick up/Drop off

Students are to enter the main doors of the CCD hall upon arrival. **Remind students not to remain on the grass or blacktop before class.** After the first session, Grade 1-6 students need to wait patiently for parents to pick them up and not run out into the parking lot. During the dark winter nights, parents can pick up their children by waiting in line by the cafeteria door on the south side of the building or by parking and walking up to get them through the main doors.

PreK/Kindergarten

Children of Preschool or Kindergarten age (3+ and potty trained) are invited to attend classes held in the preschool room in the basement of the hall during the 11:00am Mass on the 1st and 3rd Sundays, October thru April. You can drop your child(ren) off in the hall basement before Mass and pick them back up when Mass is over.

Admission Policy

No student will be discriminated against due to his/her race, sex, national origin, or special needs. Persons with special needs will be provided opportunities to participate in school and/or parish religious education programs to the fullest extent appropriate.

Registration & Fees

Registration takes place in April every year. Forms will be sent home with previous registered members or they can be picked up in the back of any Cluster Church for new members. The cost of CCD is \$50/child (pre-k), \$65/child (1-12), or a family maximum of \$200.

Sacramental Prep

The sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist are celebrated for the first time with students in the 2nd grade.

The sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated with students in the 10th grade who have attended the mandatory retreat.

Discipline

Necessary steps and reasonable precautions are taken to safeguard students, equipment, materials and facilities. Teachers will establish and maintain open lines of communication with the students and parents regarding behavior.

Cancellations

When school is canceled, religious education classes may be held that evening depending on weather.
