Message from the Priests

Hey Parents, You're Doing Better Than You Think!

I realize this is probably a little more than ironic. Here I am, as a priest, writing an article on parenting. Not exactly my area of expertise! Two young parents had asked me the other day, "Father, from where you're sitting, what do you think parents nowadays most need to hear?" And they guilt-tripped me into sharing! So, here are 3 brief thoughts on parenting from an outside, childless, third party observer:

Keep it up! You've got this!

The biggest thing I think parents need to hear is that you're doing better than you think. Let's be honest: parenting is hard. It's not like there is a how-to-guide, even though parenting dates all the way back to Adam and Eve! I spent 9 years in seminary learning how to be a priest. You have zero formal training and yet are expected to raise tiny, helpless humans into self-reliant adults AND get them to Heaven. The fact that you don't cry yourself to sleep every night is a huge achievement! The bottom line: parenting is hard. All you have are your God-given maternal/paternal instincts, the wisdom/experience of others, and the fact that 98% of parenting is learn as you go. So to all our parents, especially those with young kids, let me just say: you're doing better than you think. Keep at it. Remember God has a role in this too and will never give us more than He can handle. Let me also say there will always be people who think you aren't parenting correctly or who would parent differently than you. That's okay. Each child is unique and requires a unique approach. Really, God should send us a separate owner's manual for each one! Because what works for one child, may not work for another. Parents can also feel embarrassed when their kids misbehave in public or at Mass. Again, don't be so hard on yourself. We've all been there. Kids act up, that's what they do. Take a breath and pour yourself an extra cup of coffee.

It's okay to be parents!

Second, don't be afraid to be parents! Wanting to be friends with your child isn't a bad thing, but what children really need are parents. The problem is we not only love our children, we naturally want to be loved by them. And outwardly, it's hard to see how your children could love you when you are the "meanie" who made them eat broccoli instead of a cookie. Or when they give you the silent treatment because you told them "no, your girlfriend or boyfriend can't spend the night." In my experience, your children may not "love" you in the moment. That's okay. Because they will love and appreciate you all the more when they are older and start having children of their own. I loved my parents growing up, but I love them so much more now because of how they raised me. And that's the important thing, I think, to keep in mind – children don't just "grow up," they are "raised." There's a major difference.

A large part of being raised includes discipline. Honestly, it's okay to discipline your kids. There is a trend in society nowadays of "gentle parenting" – which involves never saying "no" to kids. But gentle parenting doesn't mean permissive parenting. I honestly think parents today feel shamed or

are pressured by our society into not disciplining. I also think we can fall into the trap of thinking that we will do a better job than our own parents did. Perhaps the prior generation disciplined too much (although I don't think that's the case), but our generation has over-corrected and doesn't seem to discipline at all. As we get older, we realize it's not so easy, and our parents did the best they could. We shouldn't discipline out of anger or frustration, but we do need to discipline. Be firm but gentle. And don't be afraid to ask for help from others. Yes, they are your kids and you want to do it your way. Also, I gently remind grandparents that your kids need the chance to raise their own kids. But, young parents, your parents and grandparents might know a thing or two. Don't be afraid to ask! I think you'll find there is wisdom in what previous generations did.


Be intentional!

Taking in the whole picture, parenting is a daunting, wonderful, and sometimes thankless job. It's hard. But it becomes so much easier when you are intentional about it. That is to say, make 'being a parent' a priority. We are intentional about lots of things in life: work, getting kids to sports practice, exercising, etc. Being intentional in raising your children is exactly what your children need to become well-rounded adults and saints. A huge part of this is the Faith. The most important thing you can do with your children is to pray with them every day. Prayer is truly what holds families together! However, to do this means that prayer must also take priority in your own life. There's an old maxim that "the Faith is caught, not taught." How true that is! Our children will live a life with God not really because of anything we say to them but because they are convinced by what they see.

Young people crave love, attention, and spiritual formation from adults – especially their parents. They really do want guidance through their difficult childhood and teenage years, and as parents, it is our duty to be there to teach, help, and love our kids through this time in their lives. You may be thinking, "But, Father, I'm not a teacher!" And I would counter that you are exactly the teacher they need. Parents teach their children all the time: they teach them how to walk, how to talk, how to tie their shoes, how to look both ways before crossing the street, how to know right from wrong, how to say "please" and "thank you," etc. When it comes to the Faith, you aren't called to be theologians with extensive knowledge of Catholic doctrine, but rather role models who believe that God calls us to live as Jesus lived. You are called to teach your children not primarily doctrines, concepts, and dogmas, but a way of life!

Take this for what it's worth – from your friendly, single, party-of-one bachelor!

Week 4 **Local Parishioner Testimonial** of National Eucharistic Congress



I had the privilege of attending the National Eucharistic Congress held in Indianapolis July 17-21. Illness kept me from attending the Opening Session, but, praise God, I was able to join in for the rest. WHAT AN AMAZING FOUR DAYS! The sessions I experienced helped me to take an honest look at our Church and my own spiritual life, and yet, they left me feeling encouraged and full of hope. The speakers were excellent and the liturgies were a wonderful blend of musical styles contemporary, gospel, the Symphony Orchestra!). I would not have thought it possible to have silence in a stadium filled with 60,000 people, but it happened! We had Mass every morning (English, Latin, and Spanish, for the youth, and Eastern Rite liturgies were available) to get things started and eucharistic adoration every evening (Eucharistic Adoration accompanied by Floriani Sacred Music made me believe I was in heaven!) . . . and that Eucharistic Procession on Saturday! It stretched a mile at a minimum!

60,000 Catholics (that's not a typo, friends) gathered to learn, grow in faith, and worship our Eucharistic Lord together. Just imagine 60,000 voices in Lucas Oil Stadium raised in song, proclaiming "Amen"! Friends, the Catholic Church encompasses so much more than most of us have experienced. Elderly people, infants in baby carriers, men, women, families, religious brothers and sisters, white, African-American, Hispanic, Vietnamese, disabled and able-bodied all gathered together in one place. Contrary to what we might think, our Church is alive and well! Young people have not abandoned her: there were so many families with children in attendance! There were hundreds of seminarians in attendance, 1000+ priests, at least 100 bishops. Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is as essential to our lives as the air we breathe, and we cannot be complacent when our friends and family walk away from Him. Father Mike Schmitz shared the story of salvation, the greatest love story, and kept emphasizing that we know the story. But what about our friends, family, coworkers, and community members who don't? Can we love them enough to share this story with them? To let them know just how much God loves them?


